

Traffic Expert Thumbing Tour

VANCOUVER — A Dutch prosecutor—a specialist in traffic cases—believes in getting first-hand information.

Hans Bredius is hitch-hiking his way around the continent studying North American traffic systems. He started his tour in New York City.

The blonde, young attorney whose home is in Utrecht, Holland, was here as unofficial representative of the Netherlands at the World Council of Young Men's Service Clubs conference. He is a member of Round Table International, one of the organizations in the World Council.

NEW YORK — Elegance is the keynote of the fall fashion symphony.

With the basic silhouette holding to the sleek, reed-slim line, at least for daytime hours, designers have turned to rich fabrics and to such details as a low-placed flounce, a wrapped effect or almond overskirt, to lend distinction to the season's mode.

Black velvet is a high favorite. It appears on collar, cuffs and pockets of suits, in applique touches at dress necklines or on jacket lapels, in suits for the cocktail hour, and in long, slim sheaths for evening. Double-surfaced fabrics, fur fabrics, all-over embroidered wools and crepes, rich satins and silk brocades, all their quota to the season's elegance.

First color choice is black. Others vying for popularity will be red and blue tones, brilliant orange, yellow, grays, browns and parma violet.

Highlights of a fall showing by the New York fashion group included a strapless black fur dinner dress outlined in black lace; a suit with cutaway jacket in the Edwardian style; a short dinner dress, half-skirt and half-clothes; a long-skirted ball gown in the grand manner.

LATEST IN COATS
In coats the newest look was provided by a three-quarter-length mannish topcoat. Full length coats ranged through straight and fitted styles to the full, loose silhouette.

Notable in fall suits were longer jackets, lower necklines,

arched hip lines and use of velvet and braid trimming. Sheath dress and jacket combinations were much in evidence for late day wear.

Expectation of a swing back to the long evening and dinner gown was evident. A novelty of interest to the college set or for country wear was a fur sweater, which appeared teamed with plaid piper slacks.

Fur coats showed unusual variety in length. Large collars and convertible short sleeves were featured. A revival of popularity for fox and lynx scarves was predicted.
