UNITED CHURCH EASTER CATATA

"The Seven Words of Christ," to be presented by the United Church Choir on Sunday evening, is one of the most dramatic of the pre-Easter sacred cantatas. This may be due to the fact that while the words are taken from the Scriptures, the music is by the French composer Theodore Dubois.

The cantata brings out the suffering of the individuals, the mother of Christ and Christ Himself, and contrasts this most dramatically with the inhuman conduct and cries of the crowd.

Each of the solos has a moving appeal and, in addition, there are specially effective arrangements where soloists and duetists sing their numbers, complemented by the singing of the full choir. The soloists are Rowland Miles, John E. Davey and Dr. R. G. Large. H. Pluym handles the elaborate organ accompaniments. The whole is under the direction of J. S. Wilson.

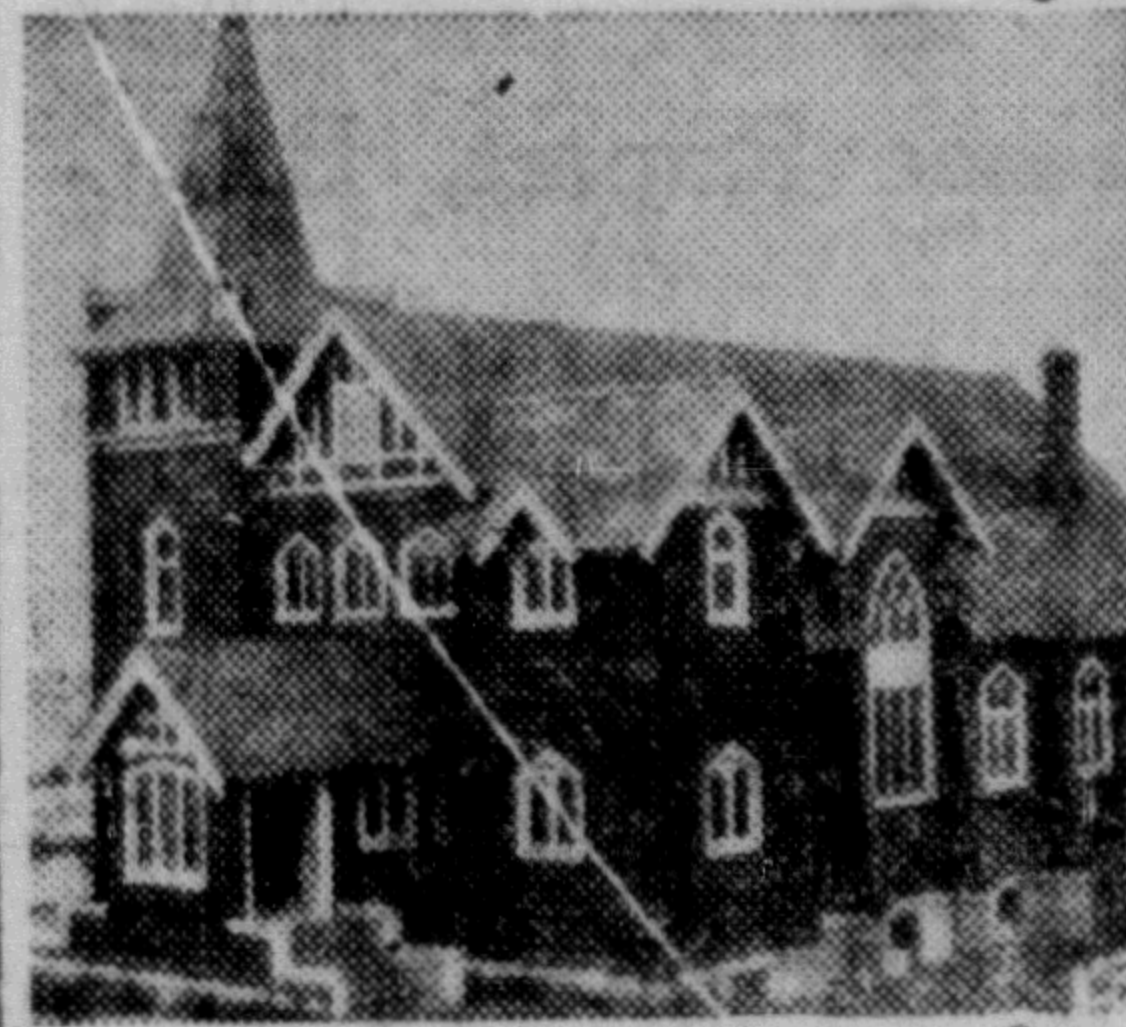
