Varga, the clean-cut Hollywood kid, had his 194 pounds pressed to the canvas first. He succumbed to McLaughlin's forthright urging which included a series of body slams that made the building quiver after the round was only one minute old.

These methods proved so popular with the fans that Varga decided to try them himself and, in the fourth round, he flipped The Cat about with corresponding violence for a full minute and equalled the standing.

To suggest that the lights went dim in the fifth round because they could not glare with equanimity on such brutal doings is probably to stretch things a bit but anyway, the lights did go down. The fight however, continued in the half-light and the campaign included a brief skirmish between Referee Howe and McLaughlin who complained bitterly of the unethical manner in which Varga had dumped him outside the ring.

The Cat himself had showed much enthusiasm in an earlier round in throwing Varga to the ground.

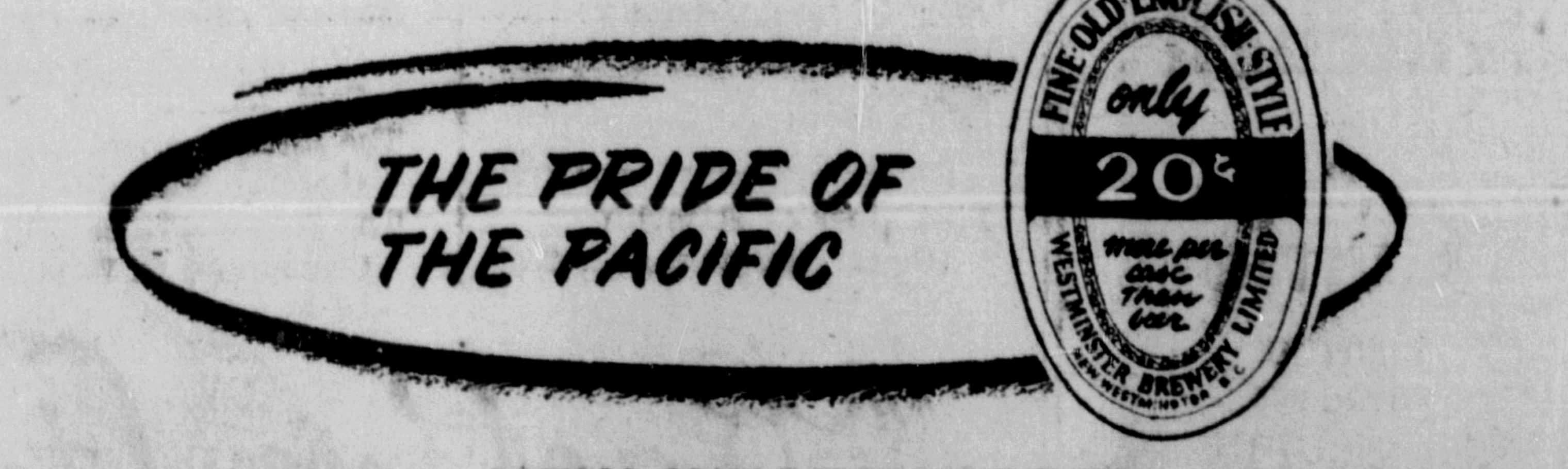
