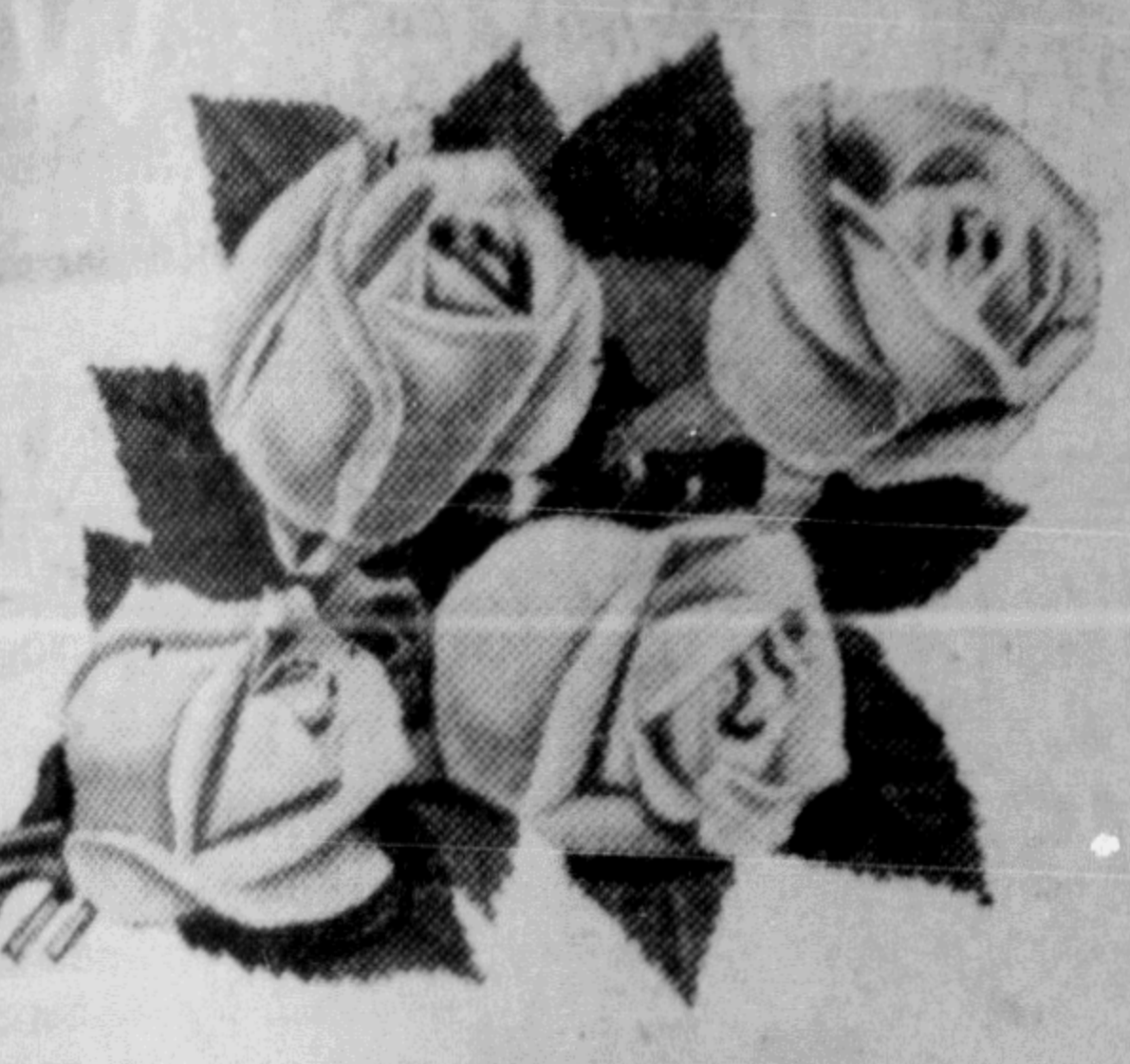

Blackwood On Bridge

When both sides are vulnerable, all that has gone
before in the rubber is past history. The next side to
make a game gets a rubber bonus of 500 points in
addition to 100 or more trick points.

Believe it or not, it is only when both sides are
vulnerable that you can save points by going set 500

to keep your opponents from
making game. However, I recom-
mend that even then you care-
fully avoid 500 point penalties
when you have a weak partner.

More difficult to believe is the
fact that you should stretch
your hands more when both
sides are vulnerable than in any
other situation, provided you
think it is reasonably safe.

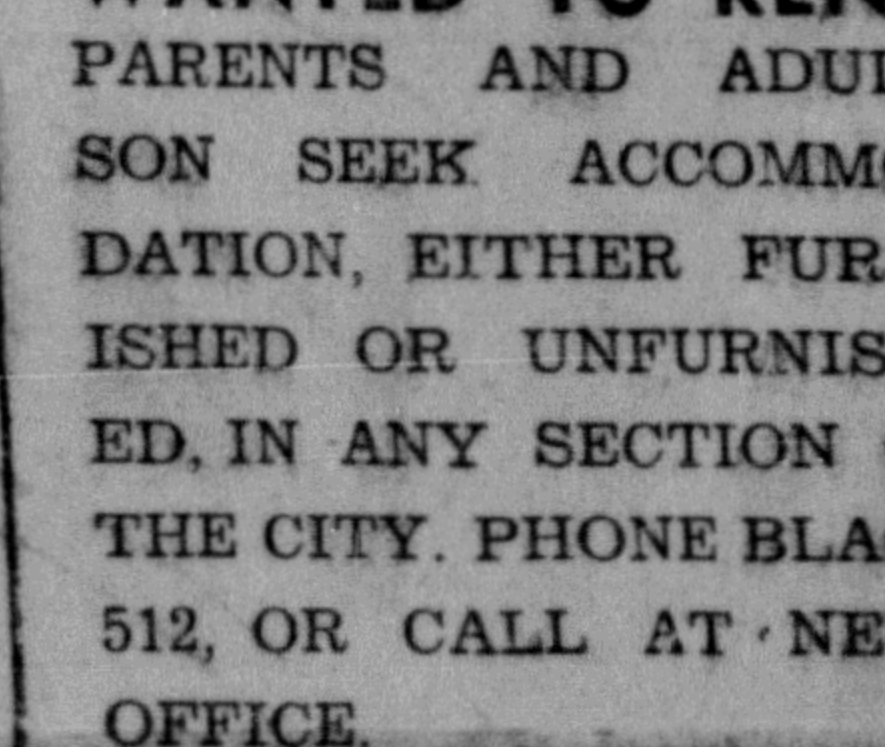
