MERCHANTS WIN DOUBLE BILL TO TAKE CITY BASEBALL CHAMPIONSHIP

Merchants 3-5, Savoy 0-4

Merchants became city baseball play-off champions Sunday afternoon as they defeated the defending Savoy Hotel team in a double-header by scores of 3 to 0 and 5 to 4.

An unfortunate accident marred the second game in its later innings as Jack Sharpe, preparing to pinch-hit, was struck on the forehead by a bat that slipped out of the batter's hands. He was immediately taken to hospital for examination.

The first game was a pitchers' duel between Sharpe and Ciccone. Merchants scored their first run in the third innings when Ciccone was safe on an error, was pushed around to third on Lewis' single into left and then scored on Dahl's ground-out to second.

Savoy strategy backfired in the fifth when with Ciccone on third, two down, they gave an intentional walk to Davis, to get to Lambie, who proceeded to line

the first pitch into left-centre for a double scoring two runs with Davis coming all the way from first.

Savoys only threatened in the ninth when they got a runner as far as third. With two out, Pavlikis was safe on the third baseman's error, stole second and went to third as Abel's throw went into centre-field. Morgan walked and Bury came into pinch-hit. He grounded out to end the game.

The second game followed after a 15-minute intermission with Bill and Maundrell opposing each other on the mound.

Scoring came early and fast as Savoy broke into the run column in the very first inning as they used a squeeze play to score Simundson. They did the same in the second with Pavlikis scoring. The heavy-hitting Merchants teed off on Bill scoring one in the second, two in the third, and one in the fourth to take a 4 to 2 lead.

Savoy tied it up in the seventh when Morgan singled Pavlikis fled out to right, Scherk lined a single over short-stop and Bill was hit by a pitched ball to load the bases with Gurvich coming up. He surprised everybody by coming through with a good ground ball single between first and second to score two runs.

Merchants scored the winning run in the eighth when Abel doubled into right centre and Rosedale came through with a single to bat in the tie-breaking run.

Dahl came in to pitch the eighth after Maundrell had walked Arney. Arney stole sec-

ond and when Merchants beefed to the base umpire without time being called Arney trotted down to third which was not covered. Dahl then got Bury on strikes, and then Morgan attempted to bunt but Arney was held and Morgan thrown out. Pavlikis ended the game by a ground-out, pitcher to first.

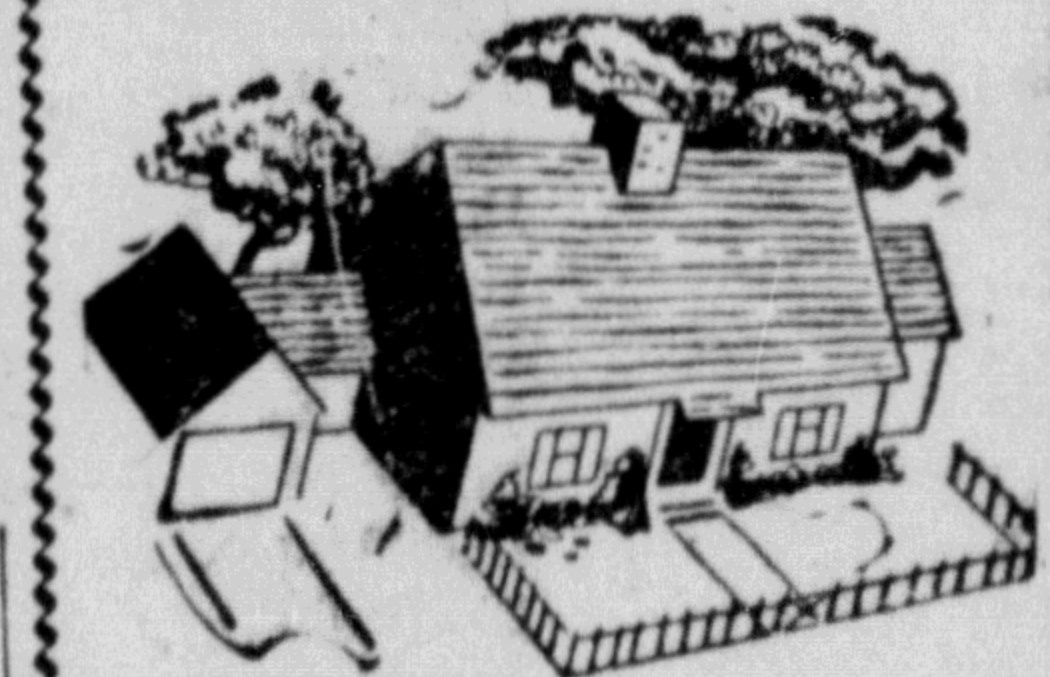

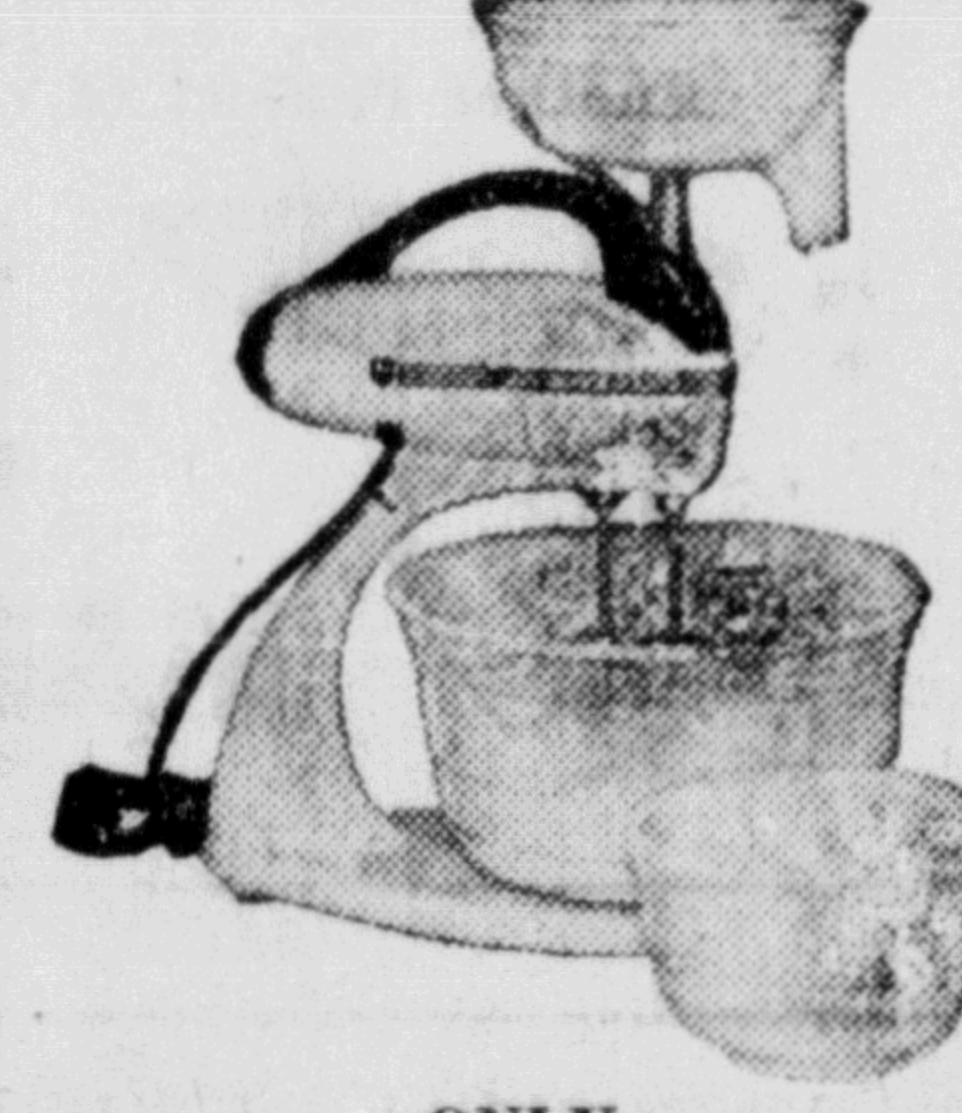
