

paper, including the long-suppressed Wedemeyer report, Acheson told in a letter that United States policy must now be shaped to "encourage all developments" in China which are aimed at throwing off the "foreign yoke" of Moscow-directed Communism.

Acheson blamed the Communist advances in China not to lack of American aid but to weakness and lack of morale on the part of the Nationalist authorities. The Communists could take over all of China as soon as they desired he said.

The Secretary of State predicted that the Chinese Communists were in for serious difficulties in governing their country for a foreign power-


