Kitimaat Captures For Third Straight Year

Port Simpson Put Up Good Show — Greenville Takes Consolation Award

For the third successive year Kitimaat is the winner of the B.C. Packers' Trophy, emblematic of the native tournament championship. Also for the third year Capt. Chris Wilson of the Kitimaat team is the winner of the most valuable player trophy, this year donated by Bill Seuby. In addition Chris

Wilson is the recipient of a gold medal presented by Al Manson and his team mates received silver medals from the same donor. Nick Mazzone, in presenting the B.C. Packers Trophy, explained that, while it was intended that this should be a perpetual award, his company felt that Kitimaat should become permanent owners of the trophy and that next year a bigger and better one would take its place.

Kitimaat defeated Port Simpson 53 to 30 last night to win the trophy.

Port Simpson played a very fine game during the first three periods and was able to keep neck and neck with the winners up to that time. It was in the fourth period that Kitimaat's superior condition and strenuous training paid off big dividends. They scored 21 points while their opponents were held to three. Chris Wilson scored 11 of his 23 points in the final quarter. Sankey, for Port Simpson, played a sparkling game to score 16 points.

Kitimaat played a zone defence that baffled the Simpson boys in the final period and demonstrated passing and ball handling as good as any ever seen in the Civic Centre gym.

Referee Comadina and Dominato kept the game well under control, calling 16 fouls on Port Simpson and 10 on Kitimaat.

The game was marred by one flagrant foul on the part of Price of Port Simpson who was out of the game for the balance of the evening.

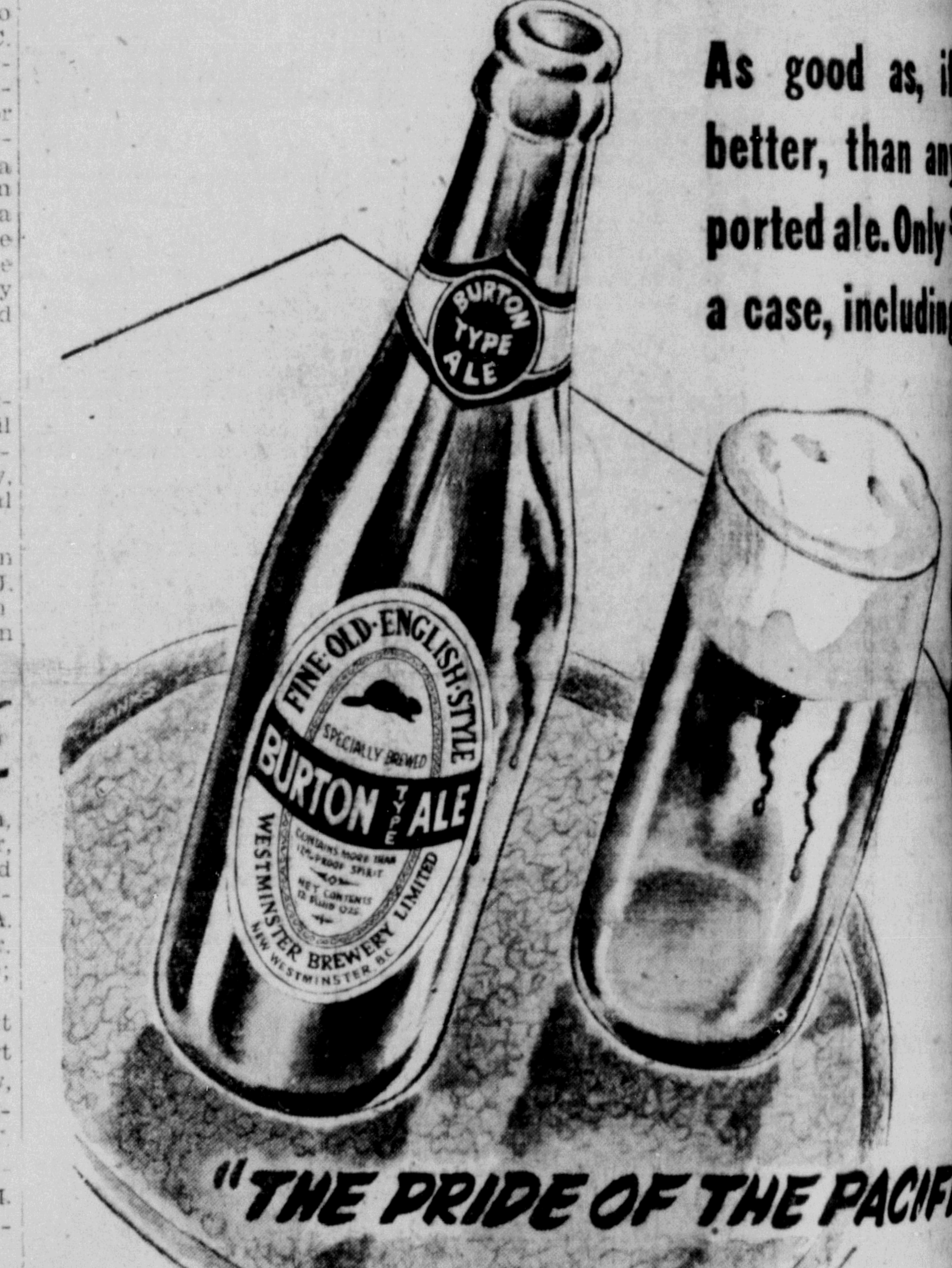
