


**MINERAL ACT

CANNED SALMON croquettes

- 1 lb. Canned Salmon
- 1/4 cup bread crumbs
- 1 tbsp. minced onions
- 1/2 cup thick white sauce
- salt and pepper
- cayenne
- 2 tsp. lemon juice
- crumbs and 2 eggs

Combine salmon, white sauce, and seasoning and lemon juice. Chill and shape. Roll in bread crumbs, then in egg and again in bread crumbs. Fry in deep fat (380 degrees F.) for 3-5 minutes. Drain. Serves 4.
