Looking Back in SPORT Reminiscences and Records

THE ORIGINAL 10 OF HOCKEY'S HALL OF FAME

HOWIE MORENZ, whose dazzling speed and scoring artistry made him the most colorful of all hockey's heroes • **GEORGES VEZINA**, the Chicoutimi Cucumber, rated by old-timers as the greatest of all goalkeepers • **EDDIE GERARD**, all-round athlete, 60-minute-man as forward and defence star of Ottawa Senators, later coach of Montreal Maroons, New York Americans and St. Louis • **HOD STUART**, one of the greatest defencemen of all time and the hockey idol of the masses around the turn of the century • **CHUCK GARDINER**, the goalie who revolutionized netminding, setting the pattern for the modern style of daring blocking in contrast to the stand-up style of the Vezina days. **TOMMY PHILLIPS**, as well known as the premier of Canada in the early 1900's and such a great star with the Rat Portage (later Kenora) Thistles that his worshippers chanted: "Never a man like Phillips, never a man like he." • **HARVEY PULFORD**, one of Canada's greatest all-round athletes: defence star of the famed Ottawa Silver Seven and, like Hod Stuart, one of the pioneer rushing defencemen • **FRANK MAGEE**, the player old-timers say was the greatest of them all and the scoring wizard (he had only one eye) who scored 14 goals in a Stanley Cup game • **HOBEY BAKER**, the first truly great American-born hockey star and a man who did more to popularize the game in the United States than any man before him.

Hockey, like baseball, has its Hall of Fame. It is located in Kingston, Ontario. Although many cities in Canada claim to have been the birth-place of Canada's favorite winter game, Kingston was approved as the most central site for the erection of Hockey's Hall of Fame at a joint meeting of the National Hockey League and the Canadian Amateur Hockey Association, representing the governing bodies of professional and amateur hockey in Canada and the United States, held in Toronto on September 10-11, 1943. Ten men, all of them deceased, were named as "The Originals" of the Hall of Fame. Since then, others have been added each year, every one a great contributor to the national and international development of hockey.

The Babe Ruth of hockey, the man who packs the most potent scoring punch in the history of the game, is a 25-year old 181-pound French Canadian by the name of Maurice Richard, colorfully dubbed "The Rocket." A wartime phenom who proved no flash in the pan with ontario's powerful Canadiens, Richard holds more all-time records than any other individuals and bids fair to become the greatest goal-scorer the game has ever known.

Hockey's all-time scoring champion is Nels (Ole Poison) Stewart, who popped in 323 goals while serving 15 seasons in the National Hockey League with Montreal Maroons, Boston Bruins and New York Americans. No other player has ever crashed the hallowed 300-goal ranks. On the evidence, however, Richard looms as the next possible threat. In four complete seasons and a portion of a fifth, "The Rocket" has compiled the amazing total of 150 goals in league play.
