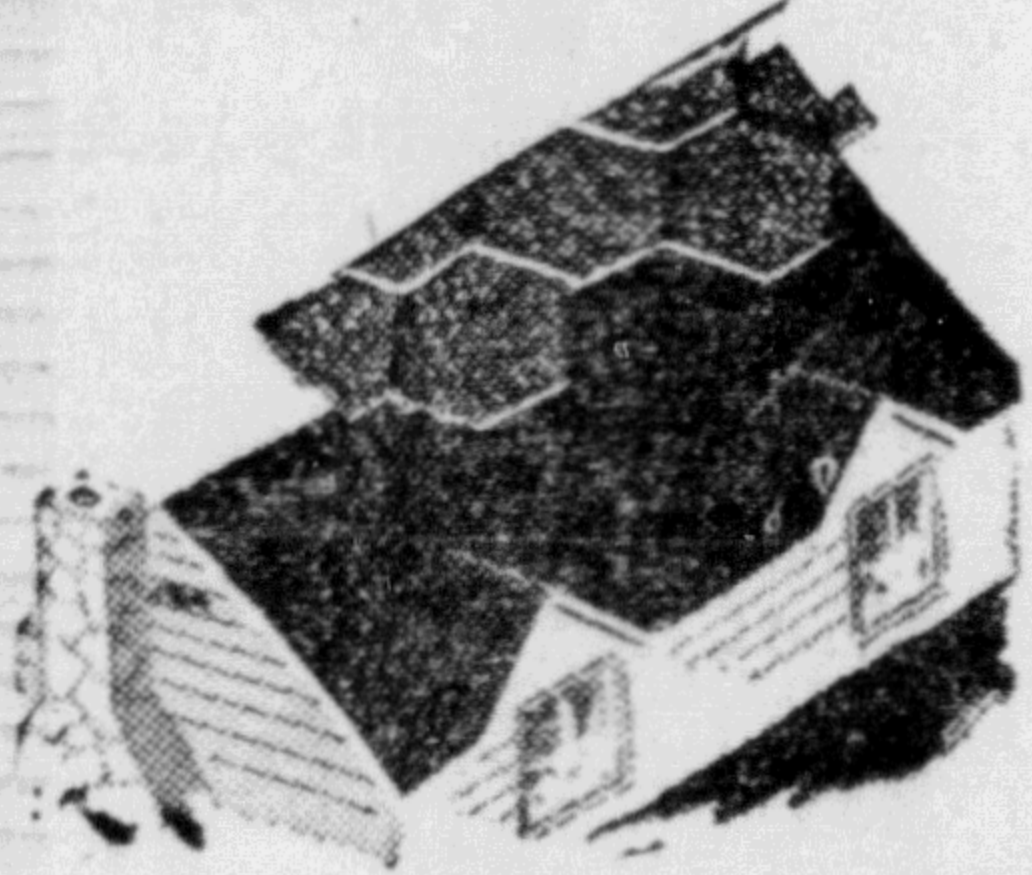

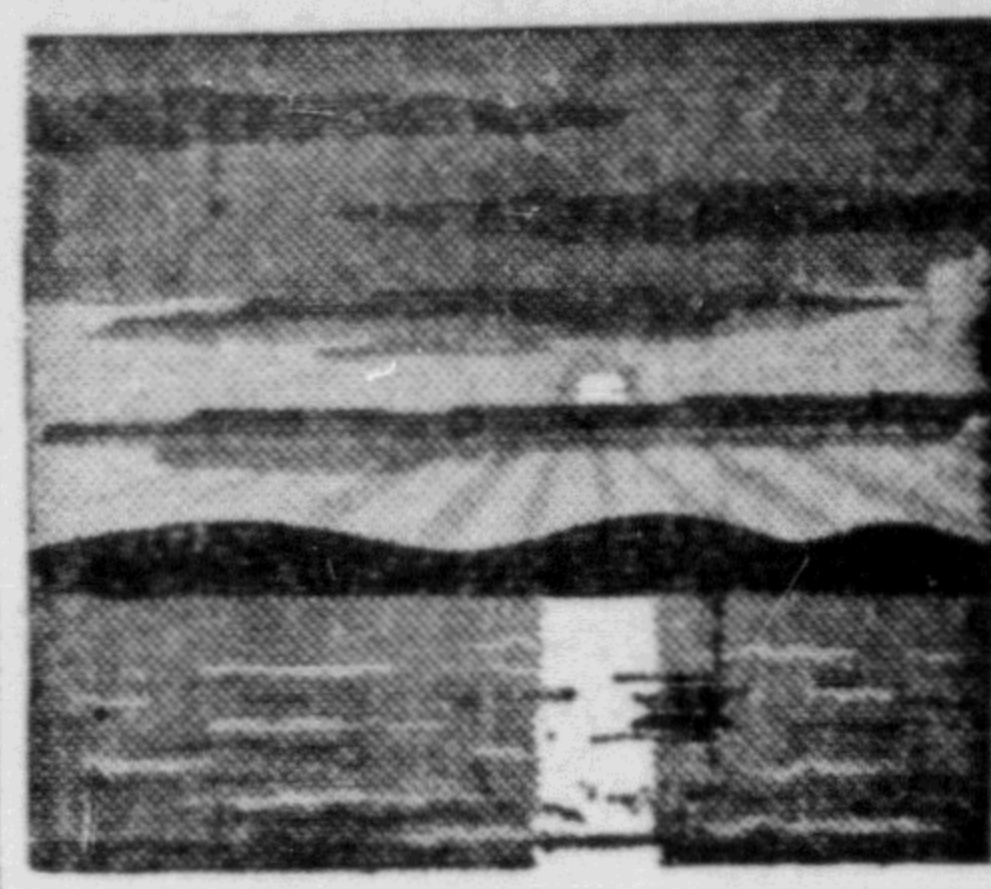

**Naas River Salmon Fishermen Hit It Rich—No Tuna Yet—Million Pounds of Halibut**

Salmon fishermen on the Naas River have been reaping a rich harvest since sockeye fishing began on Wednesday while their brothers on the Skeena have been faring poorly, according to reports reaching the city.

In fact the run on the Naas has been phenomenal, one of the best ever seen on the coast. Complete returns for Thursday, the latest to be received here, show that the 80 boats on the northern river averaged 180 fish each for the day. With sockeye selling at 18 cents a pound and each fish weighing between six and seven pounds, it runs into a lively figure.

On the Skeena, incomplete returns for Thursday showed an average of 20 fish per boat among the 400 gillnetters on the river. Later returns from the six canneries probably will see this figure increased.

Vessels fishing to the westward at the present time are the larger ones of the Canadian and American fleets and catches are ranging from 40,000 to 70,000 pounds each. Prices are ranging downward from 20.5 cents for med-

Southbound from Prince Rupert, the fisheries protection vessel Laurier was off Cape Flattery on Friday after an uneventful trip south. The "uneventful," of course, means that she did not encounter any tuna which was the purpose of her cruise.

The Laurier, under command of Capt. Llewellyn Sheppard, headed southward from Prince

Rupert on June 17 to backtrack a course which she had made out of Victoria on June 4, northbound with tuna as her objective.

According to Capt. Sheppard on June 17, he planned to make a wide sweep off the west coast of the Queen Charlottes, then work southward on a varied course to Cape Flattery recording water temperatures and the presence or absence of tuna.

While so far, no tuna have been encountered, interest in the voyage is centred on the fact that the Laurier's trip is the first investigatory voyage, at an early period of the season, for a type of which a year ago provided an additional income to many fishermen.
