Scribe Clips Fellow Writers' Sports Poll

TORONTO—Sports writers have suffered the unkindest cut of all.

They stand accused by one of their own number of having no more intelligence than the average hockey coach.

The stab in the back was administered by Andy Lytle (Toronto Star) as he looked over the balloting for the Hart and Lady Byng trophies, compared it with the vote for the National League All-Star team and shook his head sadly.

The two trophies went to New York Rangers Buddy O'Connor—"just a fair country puck carrier," says Andy—as a result of a poll among writers in N.H.L. cities. The All-Star squad was picked by the league's coaches. It isn't easy to say, Andy concludes, whether the writers outvoted the coaches in voting.

The coaches, of course, committed social suicide in Toronto circles by almost ignoring the champion Toronto Maple Leafs in their All-Star selection, with Turk Broda the only Leaf making the grade. But Andy is no kinder in summing up the writers' job in picking the trophy winners.

In the Hart race, Milt Schmidt, "one of the greatest centre players in the league," got three voters to O'Connor's 36. Syl Apps and Ted Kennedy rated seven votes apiece along with Detroit's Ted Lindsay. Gaye Stewart picked up three votes and Doug Bentley a singleton.

In Lytle's copy, the above summary is liberally studded with outraged exclamation marks.

In the Lady Byng poll, Doug Bentley collected only two votes and Gus Bodnar one.

Andy's most crushing retort will probably bar him from sports writers' clambakes and coaches' conferences for life: "Current methods of selection leave both sets of experts wide open for liquidation."

Selection Of Puck Gentleman Causes Furor

TORONTO—The selection of Buddy O'Connor of New York Rangers as the most "gentlemanly player" in the National Hockey League has caused a minor controversy.

O'Connor who this week became the first player in the history of the N.H.L. to win both the Hart and Lady Byng trophies in the same season, received twice as many votes as Toronto's Syl Apps, his nearest rival for the Lady Byng award which goes to the most gentlemanly player.

Doug (Windsor Star) Vaughan fails to see eye-to-eye with hockey writers and broadcasters in six N.H.L. cities who selected O'Connor. He thinks Apps was deserving of the Lady Byng award and gives his reason why the selectors missed out in the picking of the right man. He says: "Too many of the selectors, past and present, seem to think that in the awarding of the Byng trophy all that should be done is to check the records for the season, find the player who has drawn the least number of penalties and you have the man entitled to the award."

A hard going player can be the finest sportsman in the world and still he will draw penalties because hockey is a rough game, he says.

The 31-year-old O'Connor is light and fast and can't afford to take the bumps like his heavier opponents.

"That's why he doesn't get penalties. Apps, on the other hand, is big and strong and has never ducked giving or taking a body check when occasion demanded it."

"In our book," says Doug, "There have been few more gentlemanly players ever to grace the N.H.L. and Old Man Vaughan thinks Apps should have been the winner of the Byng trophy this season."
