Penticton Wins Second Game To Take Senior B Title From Pr. Rupert

PENTICTON (CP)—Penticton Vets last night tagged the defending champion Prince Rupert Jets with their second consecutive loss to sweep the British Columbia Senior B basketball crown from the north coasters.

Last night's 57 to 42 victory, tied with their 69 to 60 decision Monday night, gave the Vets a two-game total point series.

Both wins were paced by inspired teamwork of Centre Chuck Raitt who got 47 points, altogether. Despite two guards assigned against him, the tall captain last night netted nineteen points.

But it was no one-man team that outcharged the coast champions. Prince Rupert again showed the effects of playing on a smaller floor than they used during the regular season. They abandoned their zone defence early in the game last night but could not match the interior team's drive.

Prince Rupert made twelve of eighteen free throws while Penticton netted thirteen of 23.

Prince Rupert had twenty fouls and Penticton fourteen.
