## Timely Recipes

Roast Duck a L'Orange

1 six pound duck 1/2 cup currant jelly

1 bay leaf Whole black pepper 11/2 cups brown gravy

Juice of two oranges Rind of 1 orange, grated Rind of 1/2 lemon, grated

Rub duck inside and out with salt mixed with a grated clove of garlic, pepper, paprika and a few grains of ginger. Roast in an uncovered pan in a slow oven, 325 degrees, allowing 30 minutes per pound. Prick the skin with a fork from time to time. Make a good brown gravy with the drippings in pan in which bird was roasted. Melt currant jelly in saucepan; add bay leaf, whole black pepper, one half cup gravy, orange juice and orange and lemon rind. Let boil for ten minutes. Add rest of gravy and boil a minute longer. Strain and pour over duck.
