Timely Recipe

GRAPE JUICE BAVARIAN

2 cups grape juice
1 pkg. lemon jelly powder
Pinch of salt
1 cup heavy cream
1 teaspoon lemon juice
1/4 cup chopped yellow nuts
Fingers of stale cake or lady fingers
Yellow nutmeats for garnish
Bring grape juice to scald and stir into jelly powder; stir until dissolved, then add salt. Chill with occasional stirring until beginning to thicken, then whip until frothy. Fold in the cream (whipped) with the lemon juice and 1/4 cup nutmeats. Chill in sherbet glasses lined with cake or lady fingers. Garnish with chopped yellow nutmeats. Serves 8.




