Pressing For Post Office

Terrace Board Not Deterred—Lakelse Phone Line—To Show at Prince Rupert

TERRACE—The need of a land clearing unit for the extension of agriculture in Skeena district was voiced at Tuesday night's Terrace Board of Trade meeting. It was disclosed that there are only two such units on this line—one in the Prince George electoral district and the second one in the Omineca district.

In a letter from Hon. E. T. Kenney, the Board was informed that the Forest Branch was transferring their Lakelse Lake telephone line to the Dominion Government Telegraphs in order that a domestic telephone service could be installed at the lake.

Claiming that the revenue from the Terrace post office is not high enough to warrant a new building, the deputy postmaster - general again turned down the Board's request for a new federal building.

George McAdams, chairman of the highways committee, stated the Public Works department was doing good work in the district. A request that certain sections of the Lakelse highway be cleared of brush which was hazardous to safe driving was passed on to Arthur Kennedy, road superintendent.

It is expected that the agricultural committee will work with the Farmer's Institute in the horticultural display at the Prince Rupert Civic Centre Fair and Carnival this month.

Mrs. Jean Mayo was accepted as a new member. Duncan Kerr was the appointed delegate to a meeting to be held on October 6 to form a new hospital board, a second delegate to be appointed later.
