**United Nations Moving Further to Help Backward Nations Economically**

LAKE SUCCESS — The United Nations today presented an \$85,000,000 plan to boost economic development of backward countries.

The report on the plan emphasized, however, that progress of economic development must be measured in decades rather than years and that the present plan is only a pattern for further action.

The plan would be carried out by the United Nations itself and its specialized agencies such as the International Labor Organization and food and agriculture organizations.
