They are Mr. Crane, Miss Trenton and Mrs. Barnes. The latter with her adopted daughter who, when only a few weeks old was taken, the only survivor from the blitzed ruins of her parents' home.
Mrs. Barnes and Miss Trenton came to this country last September where they were employed at Aurora College near Toronto and where they met Mr. Crane. Work at Aurora being over for the summer months they decided to come out to the west coast their intended destination being Prince Rupert. However, they got no further than Smithers from which point they drove to Terrace arriving here last Thursday.
