**Seiners Pay
\$1700 Fines**

The forces that strive to protect the rich salmon harvest in this area were hard at work Saturday and obtained convictions that cost one crew of four seiners a total of \$1,700 and costs.

Capt. Henry Brown of Kitkatla, skipper of the salmon seiner Merle C. and Capt. Joe Innes of the seiner Aleutian Island from Kitkatla were picked up by the fisheries patrol in Browning Entrance. Charged in the Stipendiary Magistrate's Court with fishing during the weekly closed period and found guilty, the captains were fined \$500 each and costs.

Capt. Charles Filford of the seiner Fuen from Port Simpson was fined \$600 and costs for fishing in Chappel Inlet during the weekly closed time. Fish aboard the seiner were confiscated.

For fishing above the fish boundary in Barnard Cove, Capt. Joshua McKay of the seiner Midori from Kitkatla was fined \$200 and costs.

SEALED TENDERS endorsed "Tender, Government Liquor Store, Vanderhoof," and "Tender, Government Liquor Store Terrace" will be received by the undersigned for the erection and completion of premises for use as a Government Liquor Store at Vanderhoof, on Lot 24, Block 1, fronting on Stewart Street, Village of Vanderhoof, B.
