Timely Recipes

- 1/4 cup ripe olives
- 1 tablespoon chopped green sweet pepper
- 1 tablespoon chopped green onion
- 1 cup cream-style green onion
- Salt to taste
- 4 medium-sized tomatoes
- Salad greens
- Parsley
- French dressing

Cut olives from pits into large pieces. Stir olives, pepper and onion into cottage cheese. Season to taste with salt. Peel tomatoes, remove cores and cut each tomato in-half crosswise. Put halves together sandwich fashion with a thick filling of cheese mixture. Serve on salad greens, with a parsley sprig on top of each. Serve with French dressing. (1t) Serves 4.

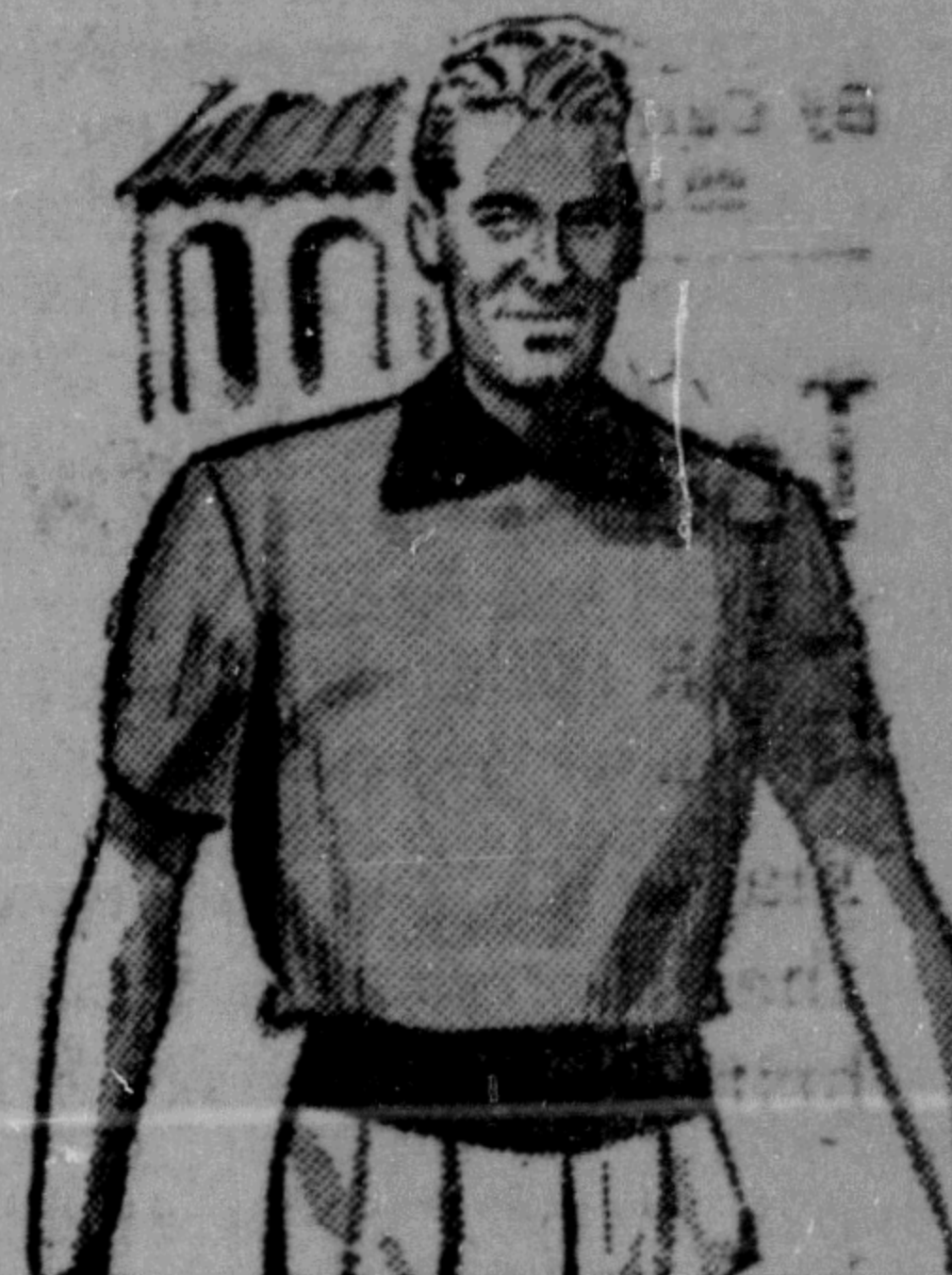
