**Basketball—

**One String Team Downs Brownwoods—League Suspension for Holidays**

Co-ops gave a first class demonstration of why they are the leading team in the Senior Basketball League when they trimmed Brownwoods 68 to 56 on Saturday night at the Civic Centre. They were short on spares and Playing Coach Angus Macphee did not strip. This meant that Arney, Holkestad, Flaten, Scherk and Davis went the whole route without a substitute and, by smart ball-handling, ended the game just about as fresh as they started. Ted Arney gave a peerless display of shooting. He made at least ninety percent of his shots, swishing 28 points through the hoop, a record in this year's play. Holkestad, Scherk and Flaten all made ten or more with 15, 13 and 10 respectively.

Brownwoods sincerely tried hard, but they just couldn't win against Co-op's brilliant play. They ended the game a mighty tired bunch, and had no excuses for their loss. Bill Sunberg was their high man and scored 16. Sunberg was exhausted during the last few minutes and could hardly keep on his feet. Reg Lavigne scored 13 and played a fine driving game. It was clean and fast, only 25 fouls being called by referees Comadina and Ciccone.

During the intermission period, basketball fan Jim Sheddson was presented with a going away gift by Art Murray on behalf of the Referees' Association. Jimmy has long been a keen referee balter and, in a humorous vein, Art Murray described how he could best make use of his gift, which turned out to be an official basketball rule book and whistle.

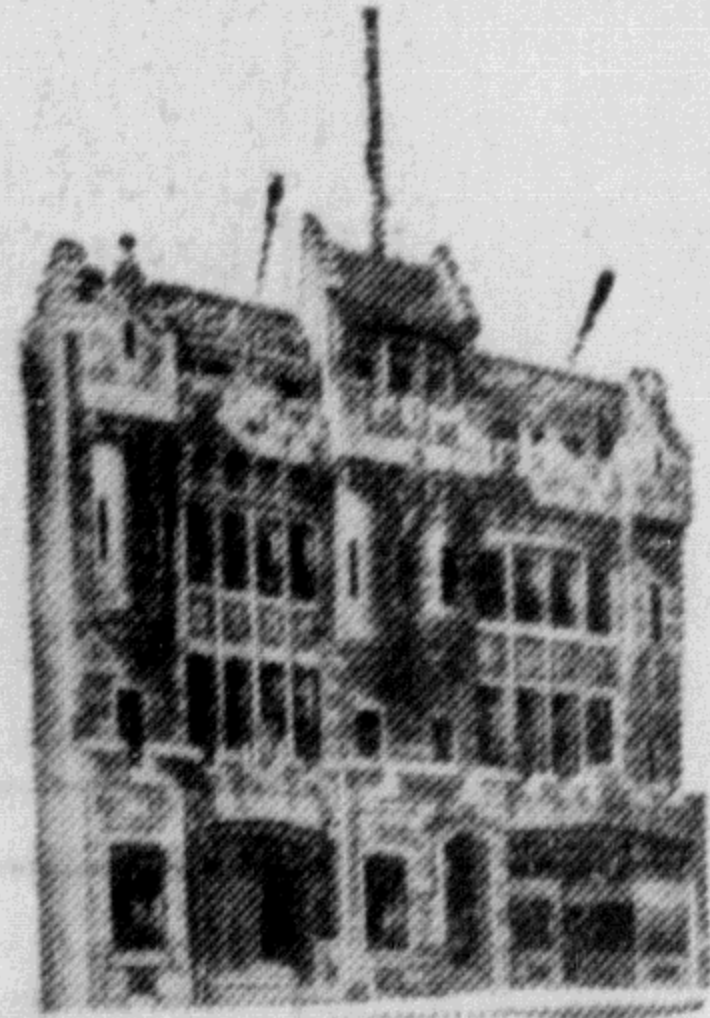
Among other things Christmas is a time of words.
