Dr. Alfred Large Not Leaving City

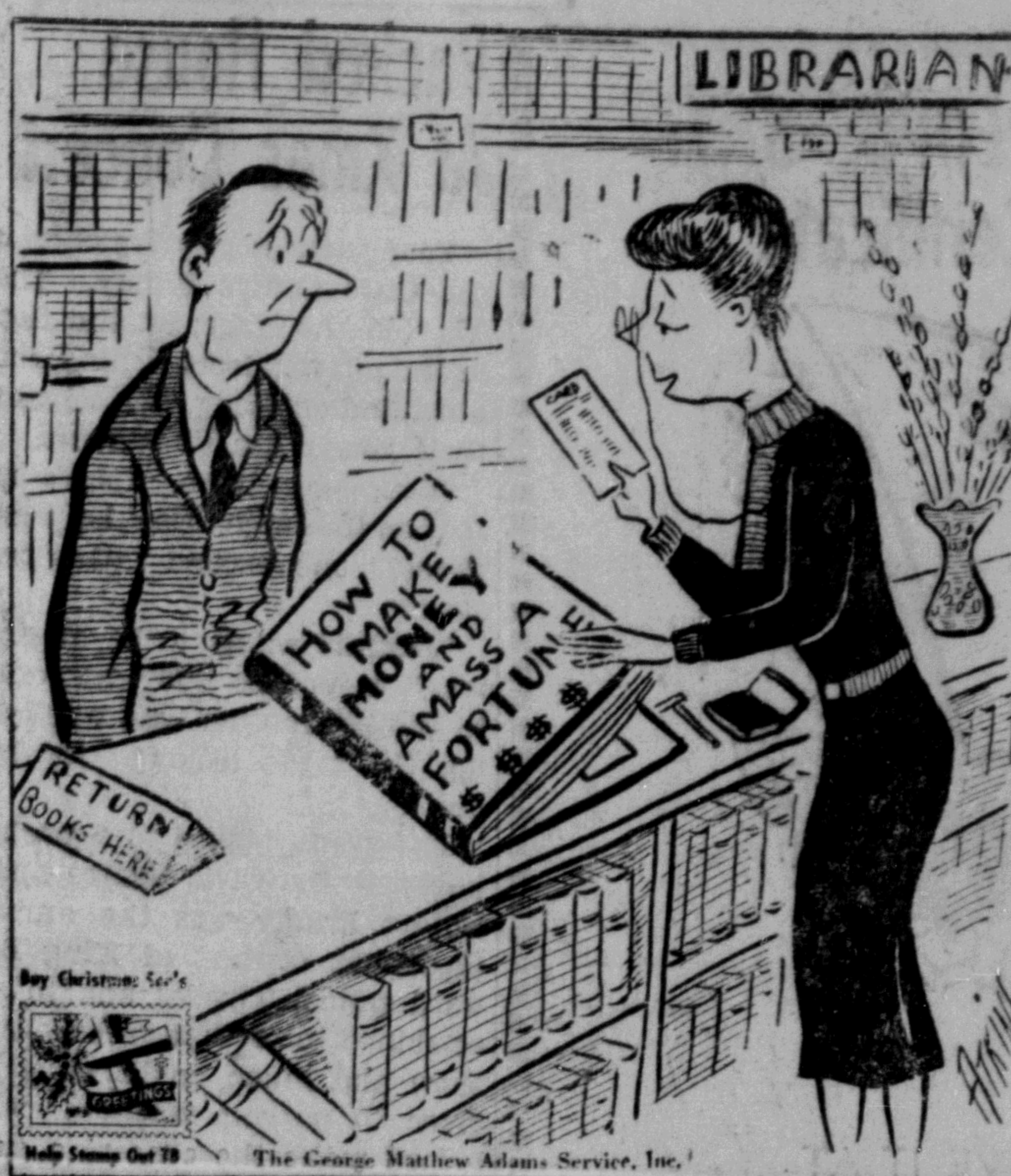
