

Railway Rates Case Going On

OTTAWA (AP)—A new phase of Canada's three-year battle over railway freight rates is being fought out before the Supreme Court of Canada.

Seven provinces are going to the mat with the Canadian Pacific Railway against its move aimed at getting a freight rate increase bigger than the eight per cent awarded the

railways by the Board of Transport Commissioners in September.

The C.P.R. is fighting the award, which it considers insufficient, without help of the Canadian National Railway. It wants a ruling that the board failed in its duty of making an award of only eight per cent.

The railways, which got a 21 per cent hoist in 1948, had asked for a twenty per cent increase in last year's case.

CHECKS CORROSION—A scheme developed by four Canadian physicists in a Halifax dockside laboratory may provide the solution to a problem that has faced ship owners since steel hulls were first used—how to prevent corrosion. These two Royal Canadian Navy photos show how effective the new process has been on naval vessels. Left photo shows a corroded, rusted keel and propeller after five months under water. Up per right is a zinc plate which, when it reacted with steel and sea water, was supposed to generate an electric current and prevent corrosion. It never was satisfactory. The four physicists substituted magnesium bars for the zinc since that metal generates more intense current. The photo at right shows how little corrosion there is on the propeller of a vessel so equipped after months of underwater exposure. (C. P. Photo)
