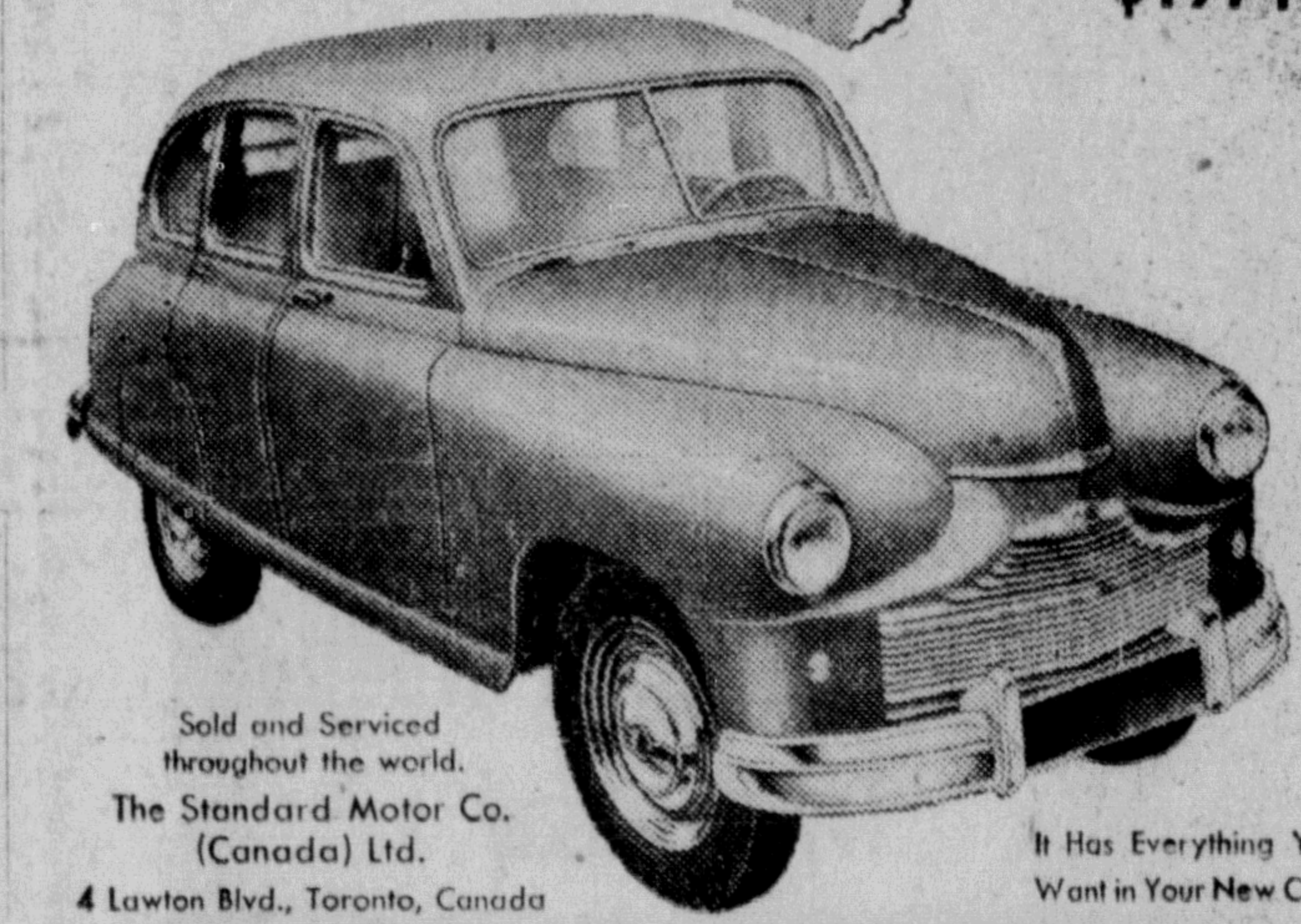
Mr. and Mrs. J. G. Anderson returned to the city on the Princess Norah this afternoon from Ketchikan where they have been spending a few days.
