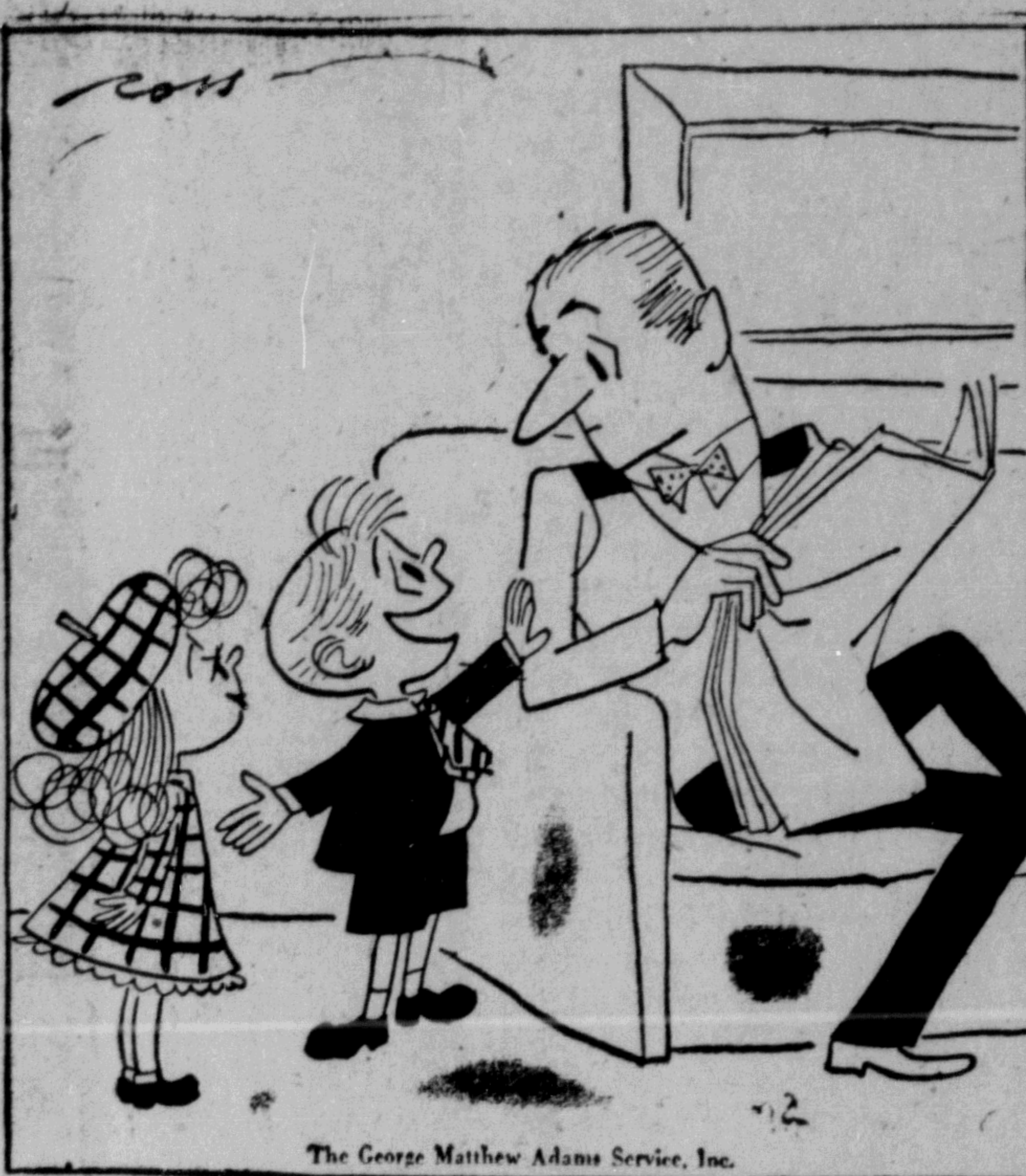

Consider Allied Atomic Arming

WASHINGTON (9)— American military officials are considering the idea that the United States should arm its North Atlantic allies with atomic bombs. Discussion is in the preliminary state. Military authorities still are far from a recommendation on which President Truman might base a proposal to Congress. The idea of placing atomic bombs within reach of Britain, France and other allies is being explored thoroughly. However, military arguments are developing both for and against it.
