Part of Heights To Have New Road

City council is preparing to act upon a petition of property owners of the Rushbrook Heights area for new roadways on various streets there. Necessary bylaws are being prepared but will first require approval of the provincial department of municipalities. The new roadway system will not be complete, however, since Piggott Avenue, where a large number of people reside, did not produce the necessary fifty percent of signatures.

Urgency of the need for new roads in the Rushbrook Heights area was emphasized at last night's council meeting when the police committee reported that it had been advised by the Taxi Owners' Association that, because of the dangerous condition of the old plank roads not only to cars but to pedestrians and children, it would not pick up passengers during the winter. The taxi service in that area will be discontinued as from December 1.

Blackwood On Bridge

Do you ever double to confuse your opponents? And do they sometimes redouble and make their contract, maybe with an extra trick? If so, you are not doing so well at "picking your spots."

This type of double is a subtle and capricious bidding device. It must be handled with extreme delicacy. It can be a masterly deception—and it can be a boomerang. The general idea is to give the declarer a false impression as to the location of high cards held by the defenders. Today's hand illustrates a number of angles in the use of this stratagem.

Neither side vulnerable.

The bidding:

Mr. Dale held the West cards and here was his reasoning: "My opponents have reached game on bidding which doesn't sound too robust. It looks like a close contract. I have a nasty surprise for declarer in my trump holding, but he may still make his contract if left to his own devices. "Since my opponents bid in a rather halting fashion and my own hand contains no aces and no kings, it seems reasonable to assume that my partner has something in high cards. If I double, declarer will probably place these high cards in my hand and that could be his downfall."

So Mr. Dale doubled the four-spade contract. There were two elements of "safety" of which Mr. Dale was fully aware. First, his left-hand opponent, Mr. Meek, practically never redoubles and, second, the hand will be played by Mr. Muzzy who is always confused anyway.

Mr. Dale opened the jack of diamonds and the double paid off immediately. Muzzy started thinking. A disastrous circumstance! "What can that Dale have for his double? He must have

the ace of clubs, a trump trick and the king of diamonds. He and his card-reading! I'll show him a little card-reading of my own."

So, Mr. Muzzy played the queen of diamonds to the first trick. Mr. Abel won and returned a trump. Mr. Dale's eight forced the king from dummy. Now Muzzy led dummy's seven of clubs and when Mr. Abel played low, put in the jack, which lost to Mr. Dale's queen. Mr. Dale came out with the queen of spades, and Mr. Muzzy won with the ace. He still had to lose two trump tricks and the ace of clubs—down two.

Of course, Mr. Muzzy might have gone set anyway. But on this hand the double was added "insurance" to that end.
