**FINAL BILLIARD TOURNEY OPENS**

The final English billiards tournament of the season at the Canadian Legion got off to a good start over the weekend with matches in the "foursons" event being played off. In the two matches between the "New Vets," F.W. Comadina and W.H. Tugger, with a handicap of plus 20, defeated Bob Moxley and W.A. Osborne, playing scratch, by a score of 150-141. A well-played run of 26 by Comadina was the only break to be recorded during the day's play.

J. Bremner and D.W. Nixon, with a handicap of plus 60, had

too big a lead on their opponents G.R. Brett and R.M. MacLeod, playing scratch, who were slow in getting started, with the result that the game ended in a 150 to 103 victory for the Bremen-Nixon combination.

In the first match between "foursomes" of the "Old Vets" Jack Judge and Alex Harvey, playing scratch, were both in form from the start of the game and showed no mercy on their opponents W.L. Gordon and J. Lawrie, whose handicap was plus 15, winning easily with a score of 150-56.

Further games in this tournament are scheduled for tonight. 


