

## Looking For A Light

IT IS to be hoped that statesmanship rather than politics will prevail in dealing with the perilous international crisis which has followed the military disaster in Korea.

Great Britain, fortified by her recognition of Communist China many months ago, is in advantageous position to negotiate with effectiveness and honor. It is quite seemly for Prime Minister Attlee to take the lead in advocating the negotiating of peace.

British opinion appears to be that peace could have been negotiated with prestige two weeks ago before General MacArthur launched his "Finish the war by Christmas" offensive. Now, with serious military reverses against the United Nations forces, it may be peace with appeasement rather than peace with prestige.

This is where statesmanship rather than politics comes in. If the decision is for a military victory rather than a negotiated peace, it may require most drastic measures to achieve that end. Herein lies the seriousness of terrible decisions.

And evidently, unless there is some unexpected turn in the apparent course of events, these serious decisions must be made within a few days. There can be no temporizing now.

Never before was there a war crisis more tense, more suspenseful than this. And, in some ways too, it may be said there was never a blacker.

There are dark days, indeed. Yet a hopeful world still looks for light. Whence shall it come? Maybe old Britain could be the peacemaker.


