The Experts Say

Housekeeping Time Recipes—In these busy days of spring-cleaning the average homemaker hasn't much time to think about whipping up fancy meals for the family.

If she's wise she'll keep a few easy-to-make recipes on hand which she can turn to at a moment's notice.

Here is Lemon Pudding which doesn't require much preparation and always turns out well.

Ingredients: one cup sugar, one tablespoon butter, two tablespoons flour, one lemon, one cup of milk, two eggs.

Cream the butter, sugar and flour. Add the egg yolks, milk and the juice and grated rind of the lemon. Before putting into a buttered baking-dish fold in the two stiffly-beaten egg whites. Bake in a pan of water for one-half hour.

This dessert has a custard bottom and a sponge top. It is delicious whether served hot or cold.

Egg-In-A-Nest—A novel way of serving eggs either as a luncheon or breakfast dish.

Separate the yolks from the whites. Pile the stiffly-beaten whites on slices of thinly buttered toast. In the centre of each put one of the egg yolks. Sprinkle with salt and pepper and brown in oven.

Dishes on Trains—Young travellers will be fascinated by the novel children's dishes now being used aboard dining-cars.

Made by Medalta Potteries, Medicine Hat, Alta., the dishes are in jonquil yellow and white with pictures destined to gladden the heart of any child. There is a gay giraffe being fed

leaves by a small boy and a picture of Mary and her little lamb. To make it easier for Mother these pictures have been printed on the bottoms of the dishes—thus junior must eat his porridge right through to the last teaspoonful before he can see the whole of the picture.

Hints For Spring Housecleaning—A torn cotton blind may be repaired by dipping a piece of the same material into hot starch. Place the patch neatly on top of the tear and press with a hot iron.

If windows are very dirty wipe them with a damp cloth and then again with a cloth dipped in methylated spirit. No polishing is required.

When putting up curtains on small curtain rods, slip a thimble over the end of the rod. The curtain slips on easily and no threads are pulled.

A carpet which has been soiled with soot or shoe polish may be cleaned by dissolving a little fuller's earth in a mixture of equal parts cold water and ammonia. The mixture is applied with a soft cloth. It should be allowed to dry on the material and then all particles are removed with a fairly stiff brush.
