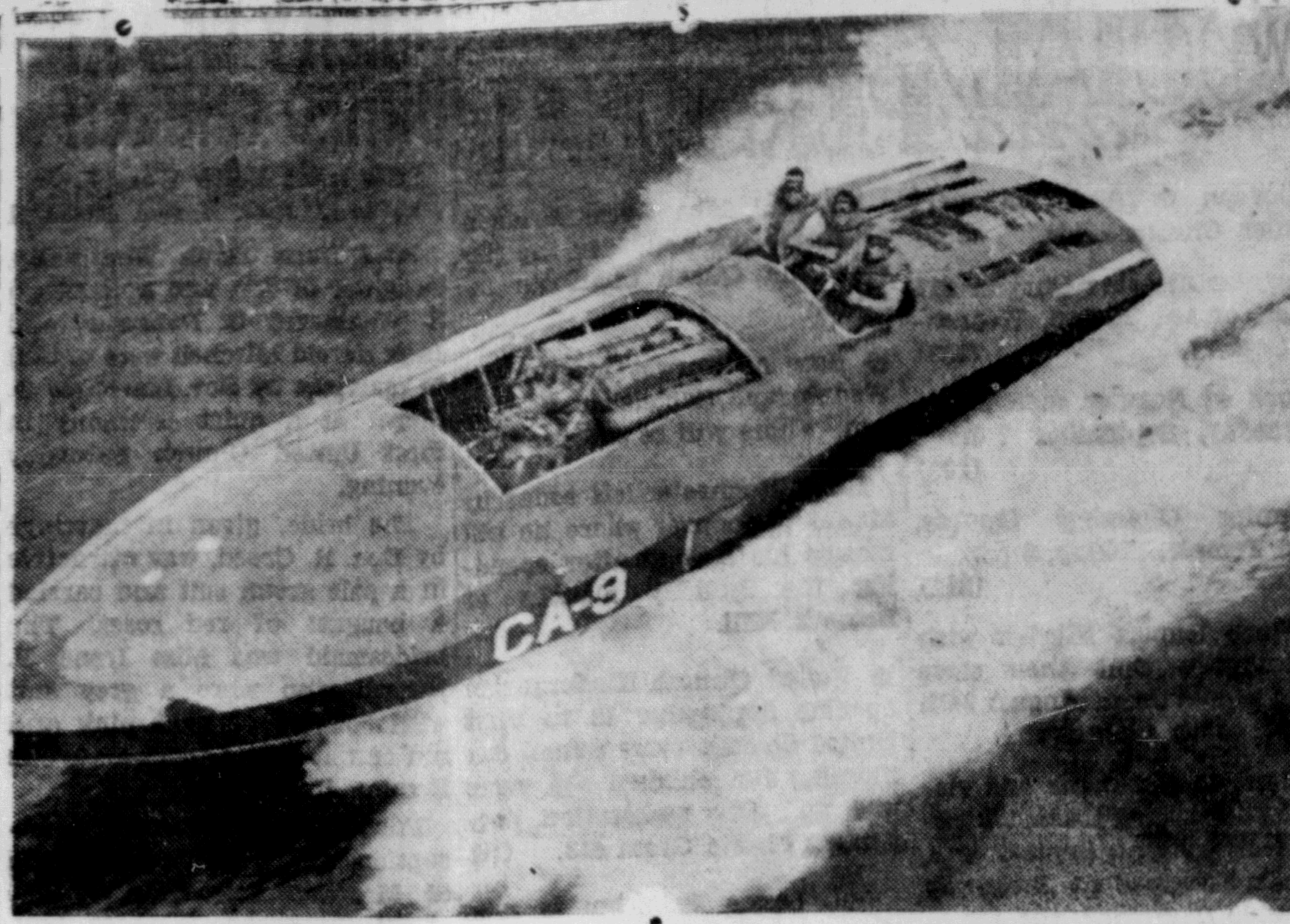

## Sport Shots

"Col. Sam," a lover of thoroughbreds who never cared about the size of a purse, is planning to retire from the Canadian horse racing scene. "Colonel Sam"—R. S. McLaughlin of Oshawa, Ont.—will sell his entire farm and equipment soon, it was announced recently, bearing out rumors last year that his colors would not be seen on the tracks much longer.

The 85-year old automobile magnate made by far the greatest contributions to Canadian horse racing industry in the last 15 or 20 years, says Jim (Toronto Globe and Mail) Coleman. "He ran his horses as every horseman should—to win." He has been a sportsman who raced his horses only for the personal pleasures which their victories gave him—the purses which they won meant nothing to him because they repaid only a small fraction of the vast sum he invested.

"Only Col. McLaughlin and his immediate staff know how much he has expended on thoroughbred racing stock in the last 20 years. We would guess that the operation of his breeding establishment and racing stable has run into millions of dollars." According to records, there were only three years in which the earnings of "Col. Sam's" horses came close to repaying him. In 1946, he won \$90,000 in purses; in 1947, \$122,420; and \$70,000 in 1948.

"Unlike many of the great American breeders, Col. McLaughlin didn't breed his horses for public sale. He bred each of them to race in his own colors. However, if they didn't prove to be stakes-winning quality they were dropped into claiming races from which less wealthy horsemen claimed them with alacrity. Many a 'gypsy' horseman has made himself an excellent living, racing a horse that was discarded by the McLaughlin stable."
