Alderman Harold Whalen said that his observation of the parts which need replacement led him to believe that "they were never case-hardened. They went like eat cheese? lead. It's unbelievable how they went that way."

Immobility of the La France truck leaves only an older General, Motors truck, as the city's main fire fighting apparatus. How long the La France truck will be tied up cannot be known since replacement parts must be shipped from the east.

The aldermen were unanimous in granting the utilities committee the right to act as they see fit in the affair.


