Canada's Force Is 6,775 Men

OTTAWA — Defence Minister Claxton said Thursday Canada's special force will go into the field 6,775 strong. It will have 3,000 reinforcements and in its ranks there will be 1,000 regulars.

It would be ready to undertake unit and other formation training within ten weeks from now after completing basic and advanced individual training. It could go anywhere—to Korea, to Atlantic Alliance zones or remain home.

In an area of 6,000 square miles southeast of Lake Winnipeg there are 3,000 lakes.

Impressive Ceremonies

Statue from Famous Quebec Shrine, Cap de la Madeleine, Occasions Inspiring Rites

Some two hundred people attended the evening and midnight devotions in honor of Our Lady of the Cape, at Annunciation Church here this week.

The statue of "Our Lady of the Cape," with which Rev. Father Charbonneau O.M.I. and Rev. Father Plaisance O.M.I. have been touring Canada over the past year, arrived in the city on Saturday.

The statue is titled "Miraculous" since during the tour many miracles were said to have taken place, mostly in the form of cures of bodily ailments. These favors were believed obtained through prayer to "Our Lady of the Cape." During the tour the foot of the statue has been practically worn away through the veneration of so many thousands of worshippers.

Each evening, while the statue was here, special devotions were held. The final services were the most beautiful, leaving a deep impression on the large congregation. They were in a sense novel, most of those attending never before having witnessed ceremonies of such a kind.

"The Blessing of the Sick" followed the recitation of the Rosary by the congregation. Those who sought favors of cures from sickness for themselves or for others or who had intentions of any other kind knelt in the centre aisle and proceeded on their knees to the altar, there receiving the blessing of the Blessed Sacrament.

During the solemn midnight Mass, the ceremony of "Blessing of Bread" took place. The father or head of each family, each having a portion of bread, proceeded to the sanctuary, encircling the altar, and in union with the priest celebrating mass, offered the bread. This bread received special blessings and towards the end of the mass the offerers returned to their places retaining the blessed bread. This blessed bread may be used when a member of the family is ill or at any other time.

The entire ceremonies were closed with the imparting of the Apostolic Benediction on those who were present.

The priests express hope that the visit of the statue of "Our Lady of the Cape" has endeared a deeper spirit of prayer in the people. They feel certain that prayer and devotion of this kind can bring peace to all nations. It can save the city, the country and the entire world.

Thrilling Black Market Picture

Against the sinister black market of modern Vienna is laid the plot of an exciting mystery story, "The Third Man," featuring Joseph Cotten, Orson Welles and Valli, which comes as the feature offering to the screen of the Capitol Theatre here next Monday and Tuesday.

In the picture of post-war life in the Austrian capital under four-power rule are to be seen some famous landmarks.

The melodramatic story is replete with character studies and the denouement is completely unpredictable although logical.

Welles plays the part of a man who has been willing to sacrifice love and friends for the exploitation of a new kind of racket ranging from the common exchange of necessities and small luxuries from the materials of life and death—drugs and medical supplies—with the result that the consequences are murderous and appalling.

A Vienna of intrigue and crime where whole families live in the one remaining room of a bombed building and a man hardly dares trust his best friend, a place where human values have been knocked aside by economic chaos are depicted as the soul of a hard-pressed city and its people is laid bare.
