Pat Wilson made a clever run and crossed a beauty but Eby cleared. Baxter was just wide from Murray's cross. Legion pressed hard but could find no opening. Pat Wilson shot just over and at the other end Wellens and John Wilson held the Legion out. Eby headed away Ford's free centre. Boulter saved from Baxter. Lee gave Price an opening but the latter was slow. Play swung from end to end but no more goals were scored and the Motors were lucky winners by the only goal of the match.
