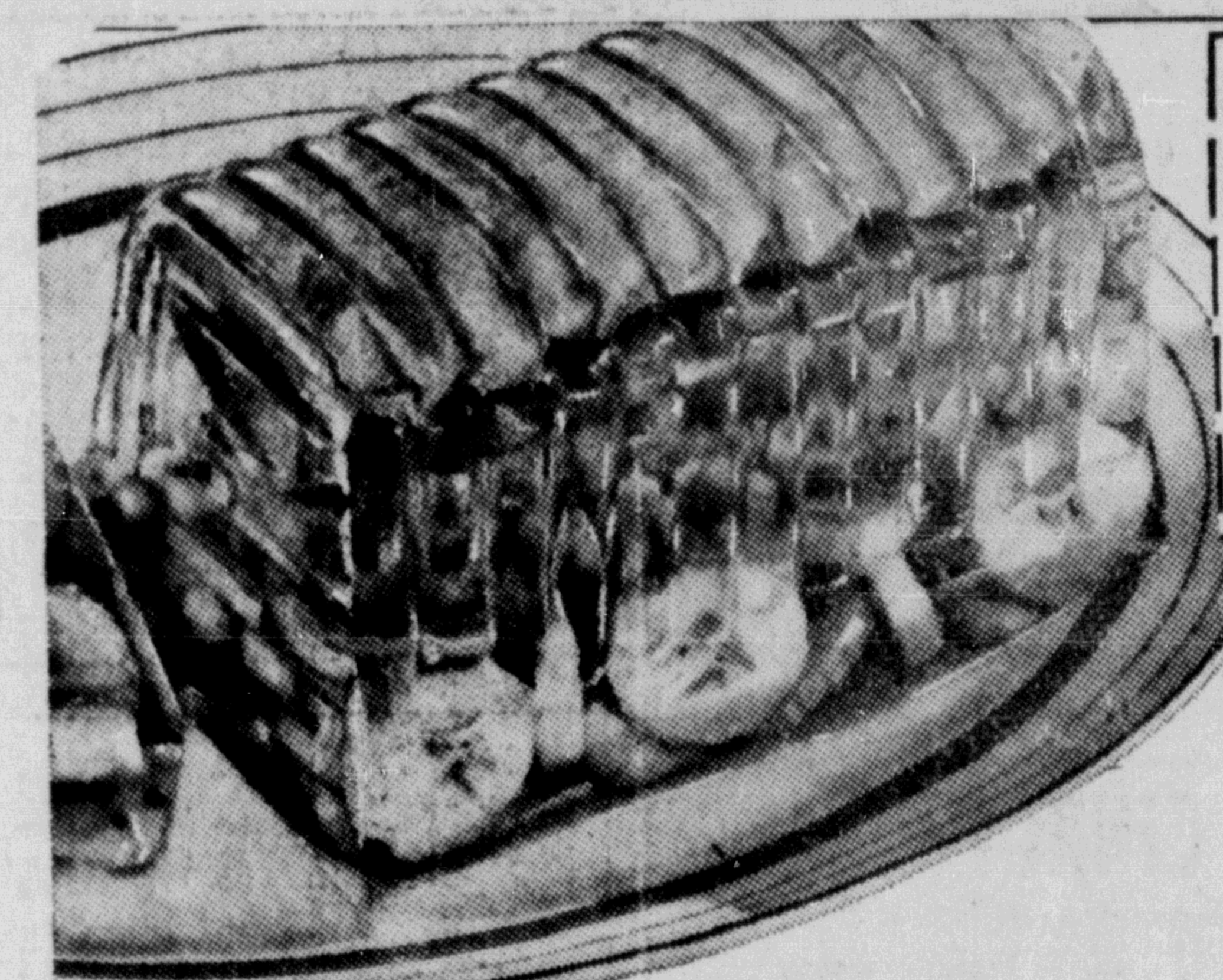

at the present location. There will be smooth sailing and happy contractors, and employees, when they will be able to look at the completed tough end of the job and move an easier and more progressive stretch of highway.

Recently added to the job were five heavy duty trucks of Russell Burt Contracting from Vancouver. Technical machines now comprise of two power shovels, three compressors, ten trucks, two light delivery trucks a crane used for putting crumps and shovel works and two bulldozers.

According to resident engineer A. J. Cameron from Victoria, completion of the five mile span is expected early in the new year, possibly by the end of January. Black top surfacing is not called for in the \$235,000 contract. Mr. Cameron said.

The new span of road will be graded and surfaced with gravel. Mr. Cameron estimated a year would pass before topping the road would be possible. A great deal, he added, will depend on goo weather.
