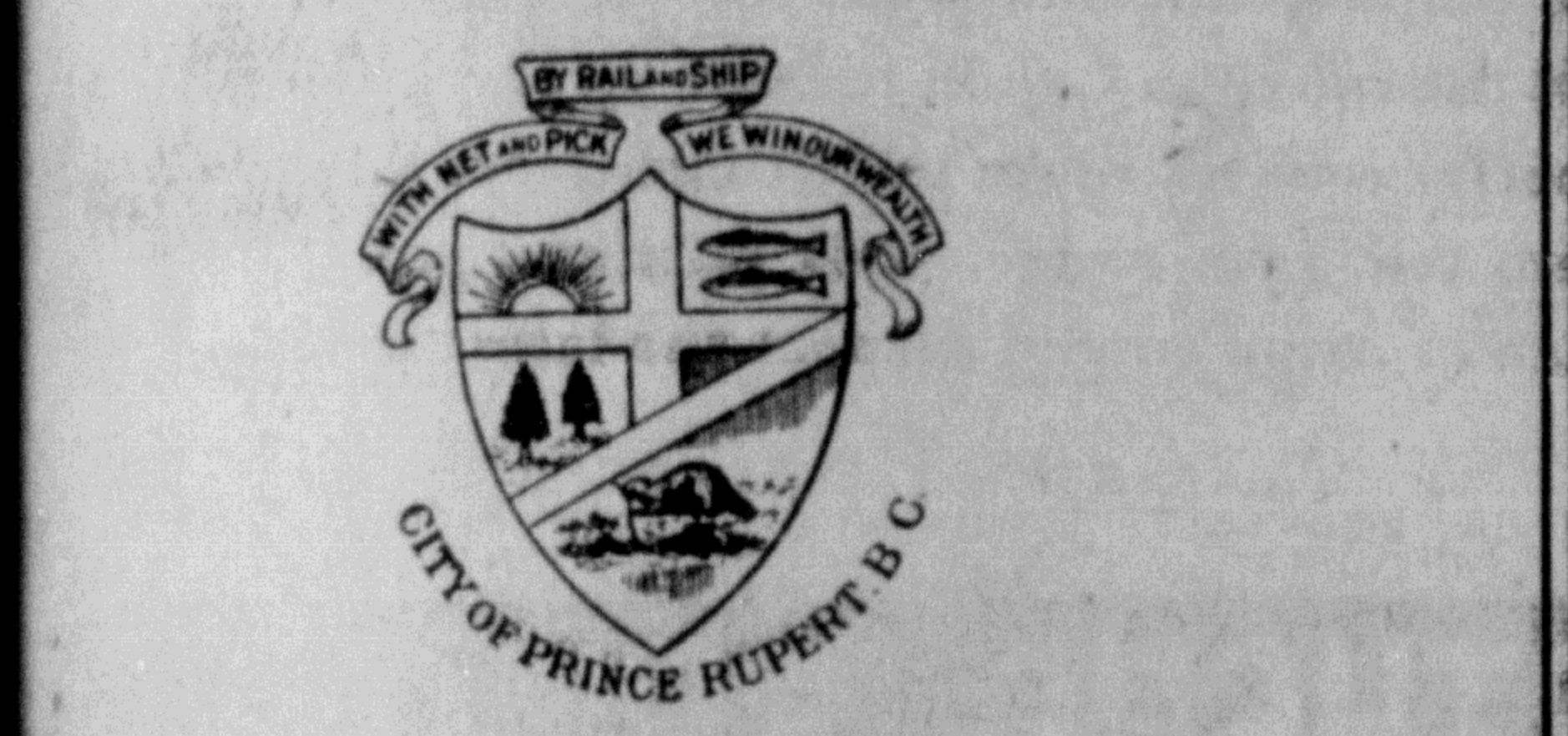

Registration of Household and Licenseholders for the principal Voters' List closes at 5 p.m. October 31st, 1950.

Voters who have previously registered in either of these cities and who have paid Poll Tax or Trades License for the current year do not need to re-register.

New licenseholders or payers of Poll Tax should register at the City Hall between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Mondays through Fridays.

All registrants must be British Subjects of the full age 21 years, and in the case of Poll Tax payers must have resided in Prince Rupert continuously since January 1st, 1949.

For the added convenience of new Registrants, the office of the City Clerk will be kept open between 7 p.m. and 9 p.m. Friday, October 27th, and Monday, October 30th.

Bible Society Canvass Is On

Under auspices of the Young People's Societies of the city churches, the annual campaign for funds for the British and Foreign Bible Society is under way in Prince Rupert. The canvass will last for the next two weeks. Various organizations have been assigned to different parts of the city and there are about 100 canvassers.

The society translates the Bible into 1,000 different languages, prints and distributes it. It supplies missionary societies of all denominations. It also prints a Braille edition.

Funds for the operation of the British and Foreign Bible Society are raised through their annual canvass.
