**Terrace Cancer  
Unit Is Active**

**TERRACE**—The first meeting of the newly formed Cancer Unit of the Canadian Cancer Society, B.C. Division, was held in the nurses' lounge of the Outpost Hospital. Present were: President, Dr. K. McPherson, Dr. G. May, Commissioner Emil Haugland, C. J. Norrington, Mrs. Mary Jones, Mrs. C. R. Newhouse, Mrs. E. S. Laird, Mrs. C. Haugland and Mrs. H. Cote.

An interesting report of the semi-annual conference of the Canadian Cancer Society held in Vancouver on September 24 was given by Mrs. Laird who was the delegate from Terrace. While there, the delegate was taken on a tour of the Institute. It was disclosed that more early cases of cancer are reported in Canada than in either Britain or Scandinavian clinics. The proposal of raising funds locally for local needs throughout the year was not approved. There is to be only one call on the public and that will be annual in the month of April. A hearty vote of thanks was given Mrs. Laird for her fine report.

A report of the work of the Terrace Cancer Unit in sending a patient south to the Cancer Institute for examination, on the recommendation of her doctor, was given by the secretary who read correspondence regarding this case. The local unit was congratulated by headquarters on the speed in which this case had been handled. Air passage had been provided for the child and its mother. Since her return on Sunday the mother stated that, on their arrival at the Vancouver airport, a taxi was waiting to take her and the child to a private home in Shaughnessy Heights where they were treated as members of the household and everything possible done to make them comfortable. Several doctors examined the child at the Institute and, when it was learned there was no cancer, arrangements were immediately made for the return trip by air. Courtesy and sympathy were extended to her all the way through.

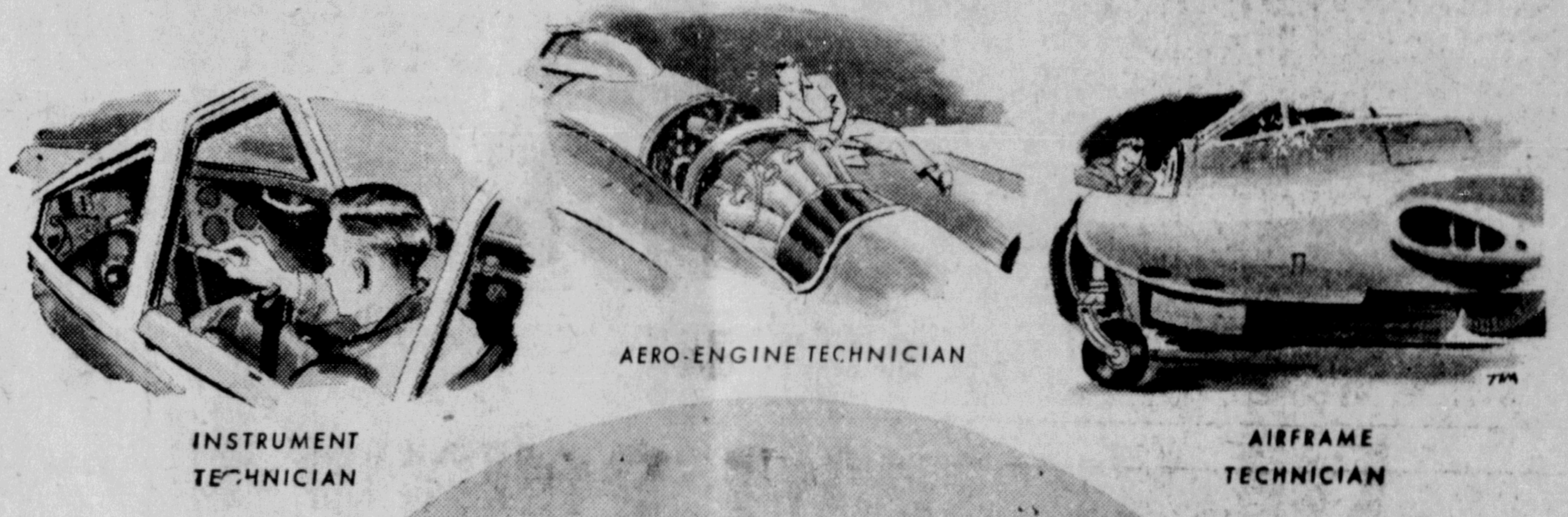
