

## London Hat Show Has Globe Theme

LONDON — Travel and the glamor of distant lands provide the theme of a hat show given by Agate Thaarup, the royal milliner.

China, Burma, Tibet and Siam all lend their inspiration to Thaarup's autumn show, entitled "Round the World in 35 Minutes."

The global trend starts with a flower-girl bonnet in hand-knitted black astrakhan, intended to suggest the flower-girls of London's Piccadilly Circus.

Scotland is represented by

Glengarry bonnet fur felts of gay tartan greens with magnificent cockades. One has a flaming brush of tangerine osprey, the other an elaborate natural feather mount.

Denmark, a natural stopping-place for Danish-born Thaarup, leads the way to the eastern countries. One example is a Burmese pagoda bonnet in black velvet with pointed crown encircled by thin bands of gilt beading. Decorating sprays of tiny temple bells suggest the tinkling measure of a temple dance.

China comes next with an enormous black velvet coolie hat edged with tiny gold tassels, and Iran inspires a black jersey turban-swathe with cheeky double swirl of soft topaz paradise

plumes, set high above the temples on a stiffened jersey mount.

The show then soars into the planetary regions with a mercury cap in hand-knitted black-and-white candy stripes. Above a peakbrim, folds of material suggest a visor, topped by two mercurian wings in black patent leather.

Most glamorous hats in the collection are those designed for ritzy New York backgrounds.

Princess Margaret, who sometimes attends the hat shows, was absent on a Scottish visit. "We shall probably make a little Scottish cap to remember her," said Thaarup.

I want you to become better acquainted with my friend, Mr. Abel, who CAN play bridge better than he usually does. Too often Mr. Abel plays carelessly, as if his mind were on something else. This is especially true if his partner has been haranguing him about a bid or play he should have made.

In a recent game when the cut for partner was made, Mr. Abel was fortunate enough to draw Mr. Dale, the old master and expert on bridge Humanics.

One of the kibitzers razzed Mr. Dale about his bleak chances of winning the rubber. The old boy's reply was, "Don't worry about me, Abel and I always get along all right."

This remark was not lost on Mr. Abel. I noticed him brighten at once. Apparently he was expected to play well—and he did.

Against the four spade bid he opened the king of hearts and followed with the ace of that suit. Mr. Masters ruffed the second lead and led two rounds of spades. Next he took three rounds of diamonds, discarding the five of clubs from dummy.

Now he trumped his last diamond, led dummy's last heart, and ruffed it in his hand. This completed the stripping of all red cards from closed hand and dummy.

Mr. Masters planned to duck a club lead into Mr. Dale's hand. Mr. Dale would then have to give dummy a club trick or lead a heart which Mr. Masters would ruff in dummy while discarding a losing club from his own hand.

This was a clever plan but Mr. Abel upset it very neatly. When Mr. Masters led the deuce of clubs at the tenth trick, Mr. Abel hopped right up with the jack and—that's all, brother—Down one.

Do you want your partner to play good cards? Then make him think you have confidence in him. If he thinks you expect him to play well, he will try. Harsh words to partner are soon entered in opponents' column on the score sheet.

Tomorrow I will show you another good play by Mr. Abel—the result of Mr. Dale's expert partnership tactics.

## Looks Like War— Visitor To New York Impressed

"It looks like war," says Mrs. Henry Stangbye, 103 Ninth Avenue West, who has returned from visiting relatives in New York.

"Sailors on the coast, soldiers coming and going on leave; just like it was here during the war," said Mrs. Stangbye, describing the American cities she passed through on her plane trip to the eastern states. "While waiting for a plane at Great Falls, Montana, we saw jet bombers in the air. At first you could only hear them, they were going so fast. Then they came into sight as they levelled off after diving downwards," recalled Mrs. Stangbye.

She reports that general foodstuffs are cheaper than Canadian prices, but restaurant meals are higher. Work is plentiful, with high wages going to the skilled worker.

Poor weather followed Mrs. Stangbye in her first air trip which took her in six changes of planes across the continent.

"But weather is something you get everywhere," says Mrs. Stangbye, who returned to Prince Rupert to find the household begonias nipped by frost.

While in New York state Mrs. Stangbye visited the families of Mr. and Mrs. A. I. McGaw, her daughter and son-in-law, at Cgdensburg, N.Y., and Mr. and Mrs. J. M. Lane, her sister and brother-in-law, at Delhi.

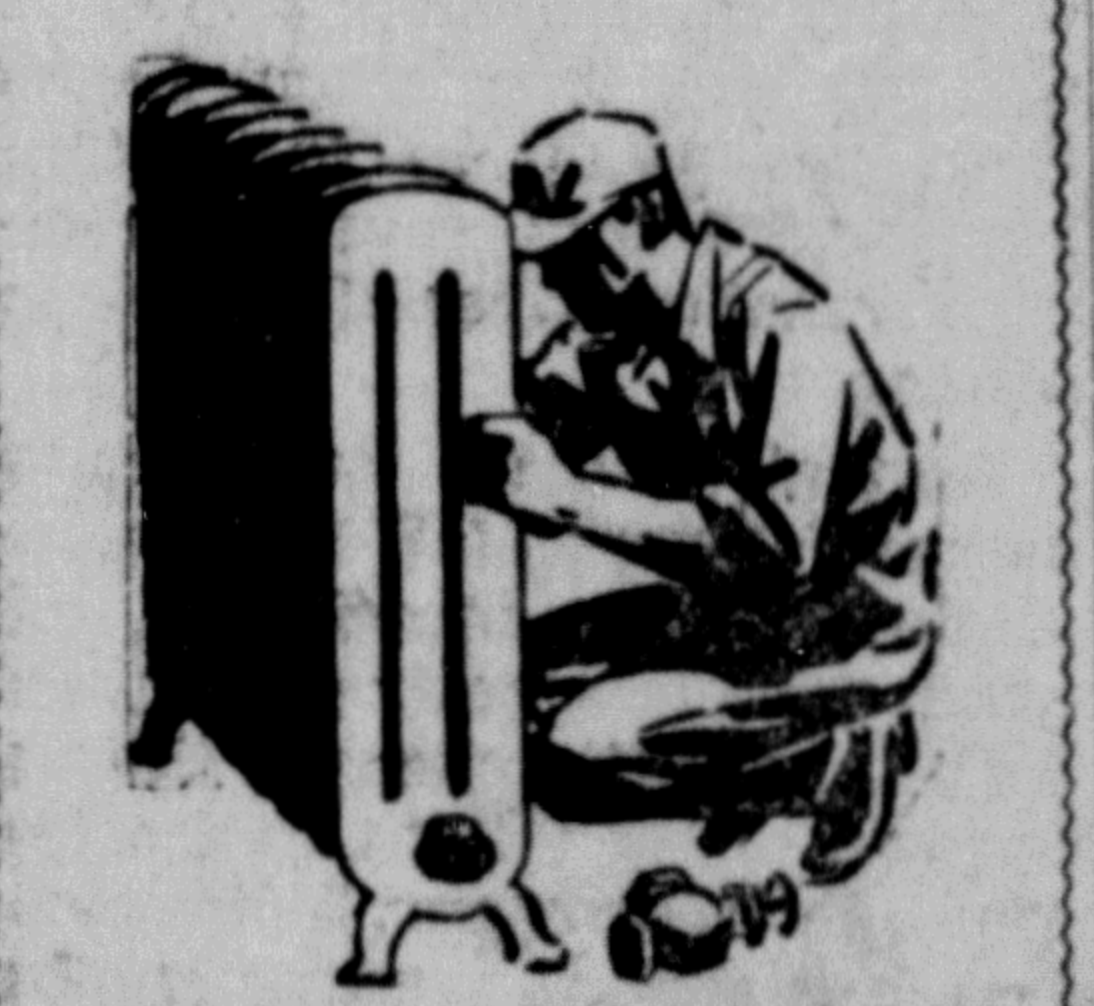
