Sprinkle with raisin mixture. Beginning at a long edge, roll up each piece loosely, like a jelly roll. Cut into 1" slices. Place just touching each other, a cut-side up, in greased 7" round layer-cake pans (or other shallow pans). Grease tops. Cover and let rise until doubled in bulk. Bake in moderate oven, 350°, 20-25 minutes. Serve hot, or reheated.

Ray Reflects and Reminisces

Vancouver's new mayor remembers the late Arthur Little of Prince Rupert. Anyway, that photo on the front page of The Sun causes one to think of Prince Rupert's pioneer news-dealer and peanut peddler, as he looked more than thirty years ago, at the foot of Centre Street, telling Frank Stevens that "though he was a little late, he'd take him on."

A craving to see the world, wife trouble, hankering for old war-time comradeship are said to be some of the reasons why a fellow joins the army. Or there may be a dash of idealism, or defence of a principle, or just plain patriotism. Like enough, it could be just zest for adventure, or maybe the satisfaction of feeling no necessity to worry over meal tickets. Providing he remains in one piece and manages to keep out of hospitals, a man can conceivably do worse.

Richard Neuberger, Portland author, has a story in the Cariboo Digest, descriptive of Prince Rupert and building of the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway which he terms "the line of destiny." It should be.

Sometimes, the bigger the town, the wider its views. It has taken a special act of Parliament to make it legal to show Punch and Judy on Sundays at next year's Festival of Britain. It was like this. The special resolution was necessary because there was a risk of the banning of puppet and marionette entertainments being stopped unless such were done. This was under ancient Sunday observance laws. Vancouver is not old enough to go back several centuries. But anyway, where's the harm in Punch and Judy?

"Only God and our wits have kept us alive." So wrote Ensign Bill Harris in Korea in a letter to his mother, living in Juneau. Nine words, yet they say more than some columns that actually tell next to nothing.

Commonwealth newspapermen will be able to work for a year in each other's countries under an interchange scheme just announced. The general idea is to increase knowledge and widen experience. Newspapers will be asked to accept the visitors for attachment to their staffs at normal rates of pay. It takes about a year to become acquainted with a new town and people before normal pay is justified some publishers will assert. Or perhaps longer!

All in all, the year 1951 across the border, should be packed with action. To start turning out five times the average plane production — to manufacture four times the quantity of tanks and motor transports—and begin training what will become 3,500,000 militarized men and women means extra industry on a colossal scale. And the world will be fortunate if, in the interval, there is no "incident."
