Ray Reflects... and Reminisces

The beautifying of Roosevelt Park deserves support and encouragement. The job will take a lot of judgment, effort and no small sum, but the situation cannot be left as it is. The memorial, already set up there, is

a constant reminder of unfinished work. Small wonder an observant tourist once inquired the reason for the grudge against Roosevelt.

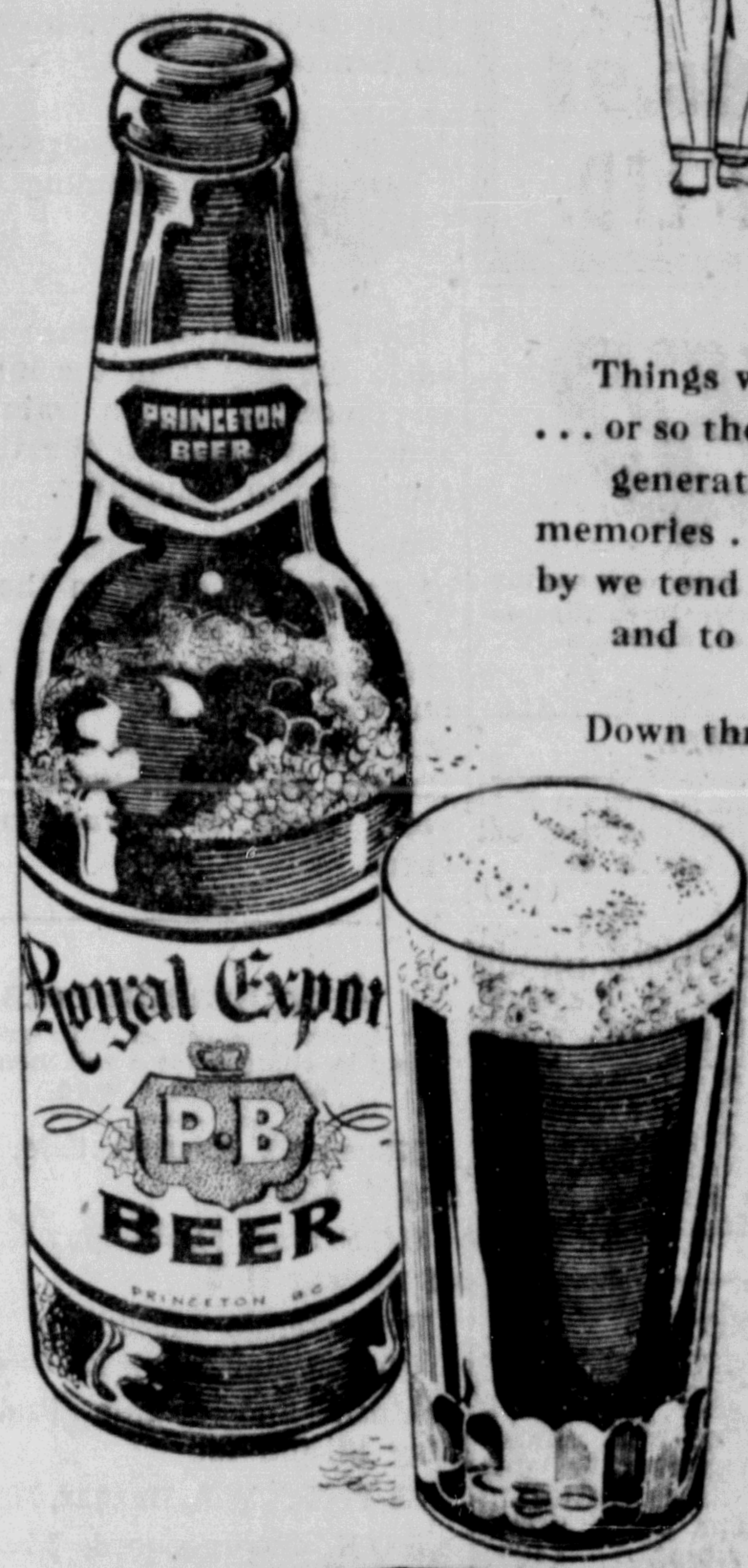

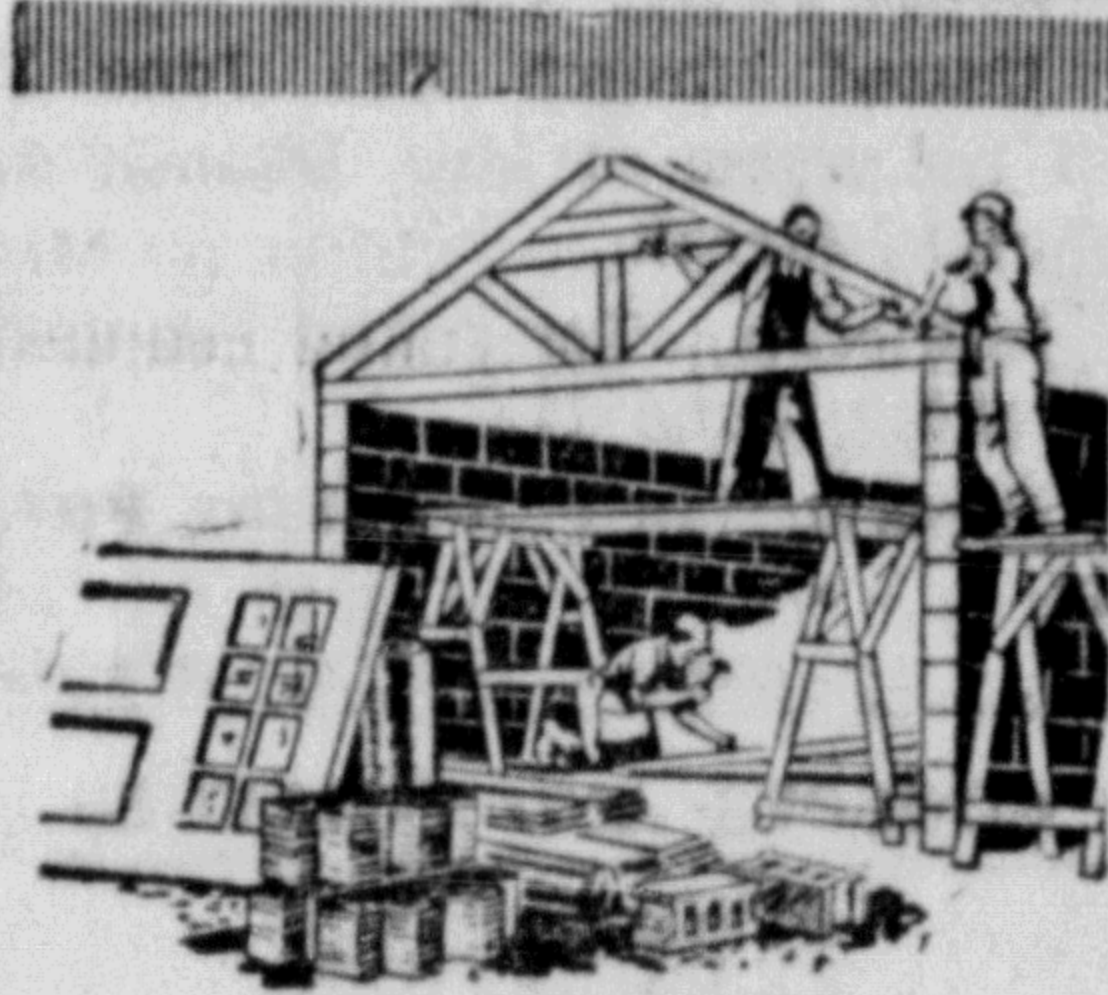
