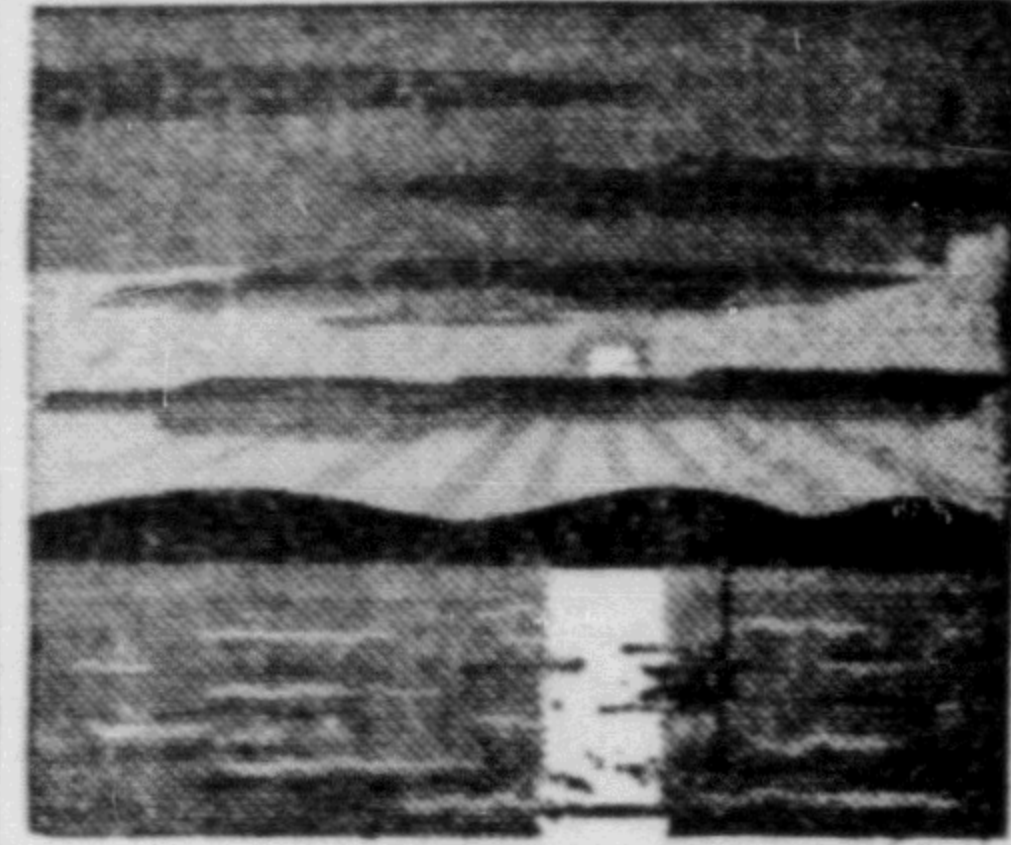

**Stormy Weather Reduces Halibut Catch—  
New River Boat for Columbia Cellulose**

A whole week of rough weather reduced initial halibut landings at the port of Prince Rupert during the first five days after the opening of the season last Sunday. Total landings from all sources up to Friday evening were 353,000 pounds from the regular halibut fleet and camp packers.

Friday was the biggest day so far, with landings totalling 150,000 pounds and it was also the first day that fish was sold on the exchange. Previously, all fish had either been delivered to the Co-op or been bought privately by the companies.

Opening prices on the exchange were 15 1/2c, 14 1/2c and 11 1/2c paid by Canadian Fish and Cold Storage Co. for 17,000 pounds delivered by the Unimak. The Sea Pride, which landed

trollers this year are also slightly fewer. Up to Friday 208 trolling licenses had been issued as against 235 at the same date a year ago.

Capt. Walter Redford of the fisheries protection vessel Howay brought his ship into port for a couple of days this week from patrol of the Hecate Strait fishing grounds. A new river work boat for Columbia Cellulose Co. has arrived in port here and will be used in preparation of the Skeena River for log drives and later for log driving. Built by the Russell shipbuilding company of Owen Sound, Ontario, the 35-foot steel-hulled vessel has the general lines of a barge. It has shallow draft and a large anchor at the bow for use in obtaining purchase for heavy pulls.

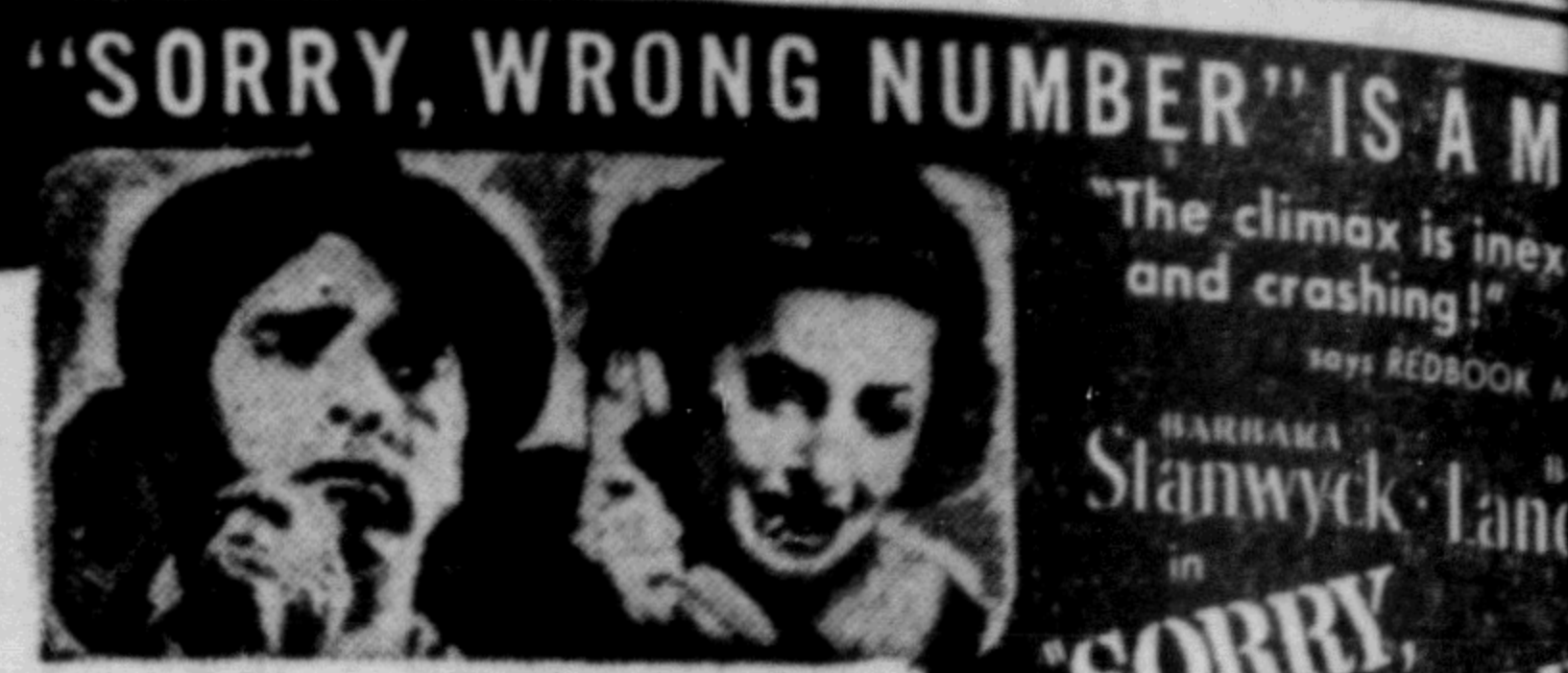

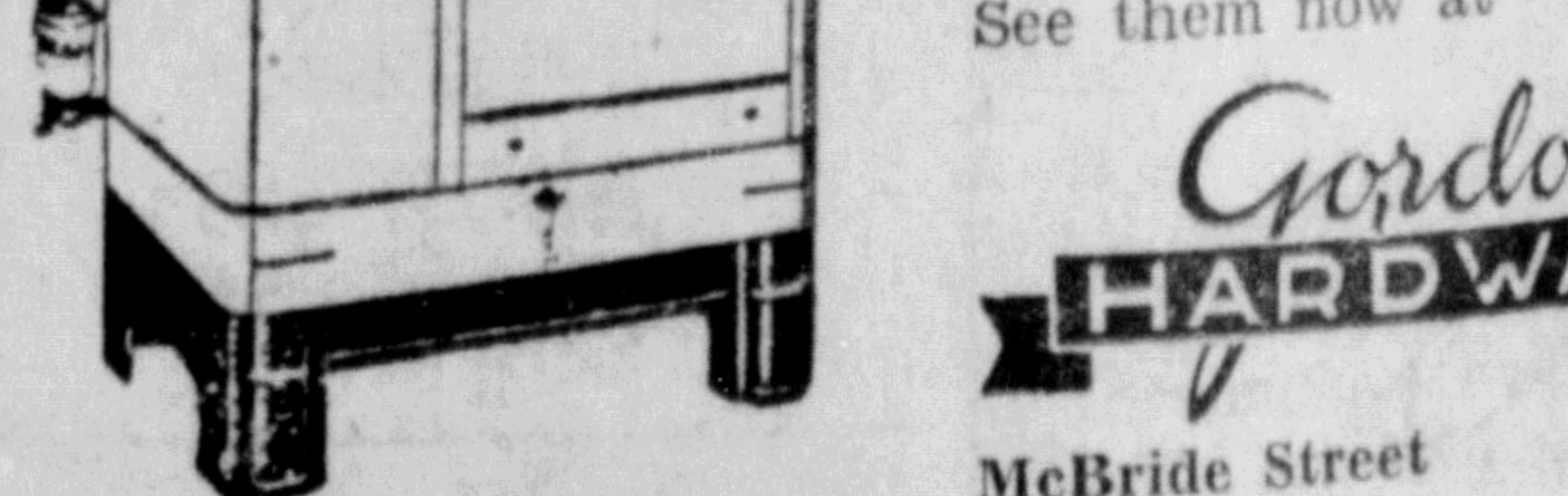
