## Waterfront Whiffs

### Seattle Meeting Prince Rupert's Fish Shipment Rates—Boatbuilding Incorporations — No Grain Here

Announcement was made recently, according to a despatch from Seattle that freight rates on frozen fish moving east and south from Seattle will be on a par with those from Prince Rupert. Cuts up to 34 per cent, it is stated, have been authorized by the Northwest Fish Traffic Committee.

Fred D. Tolan, committee traffic manager says the new rate will become effective February 1. The old rate schedule, Mr. Tolan reports, enabled the shipping of frozen fish from Prince Rupert east at from \$100 to \$50 a carper.

Recent incorporation notices include McLean's Shipyard Ltd. \$15,000, Seal Cove, Prince Rupert, and the Seal Cove Marine Works Ltd., \$25,000, Seal Cove Prince Rupert.

One bid was received for the building of a wharf at Metlakatla. It was the only one, in when the figures closed at Ottawa recently. It was from Arthur Aistasmann at Prince Rupert and was for \$10,146.42.

With the Prince Rupert grain elevator remaining empty and unused year after year, shipments of wheat from Vancouver now stand at three times the volume at the same time the previous year. At the end of November, almost 20,000,000 bushels had been loaded compared with about 7,000,000 bushels the year previous.

The usual between Christmas and New Year doldrums continued on the local waterfront and cold weather throughout the period did not make anyone the more ambitious. Next week should be marked by an intensive quest for the annual herring run in waters contiguous to this port. That should be
