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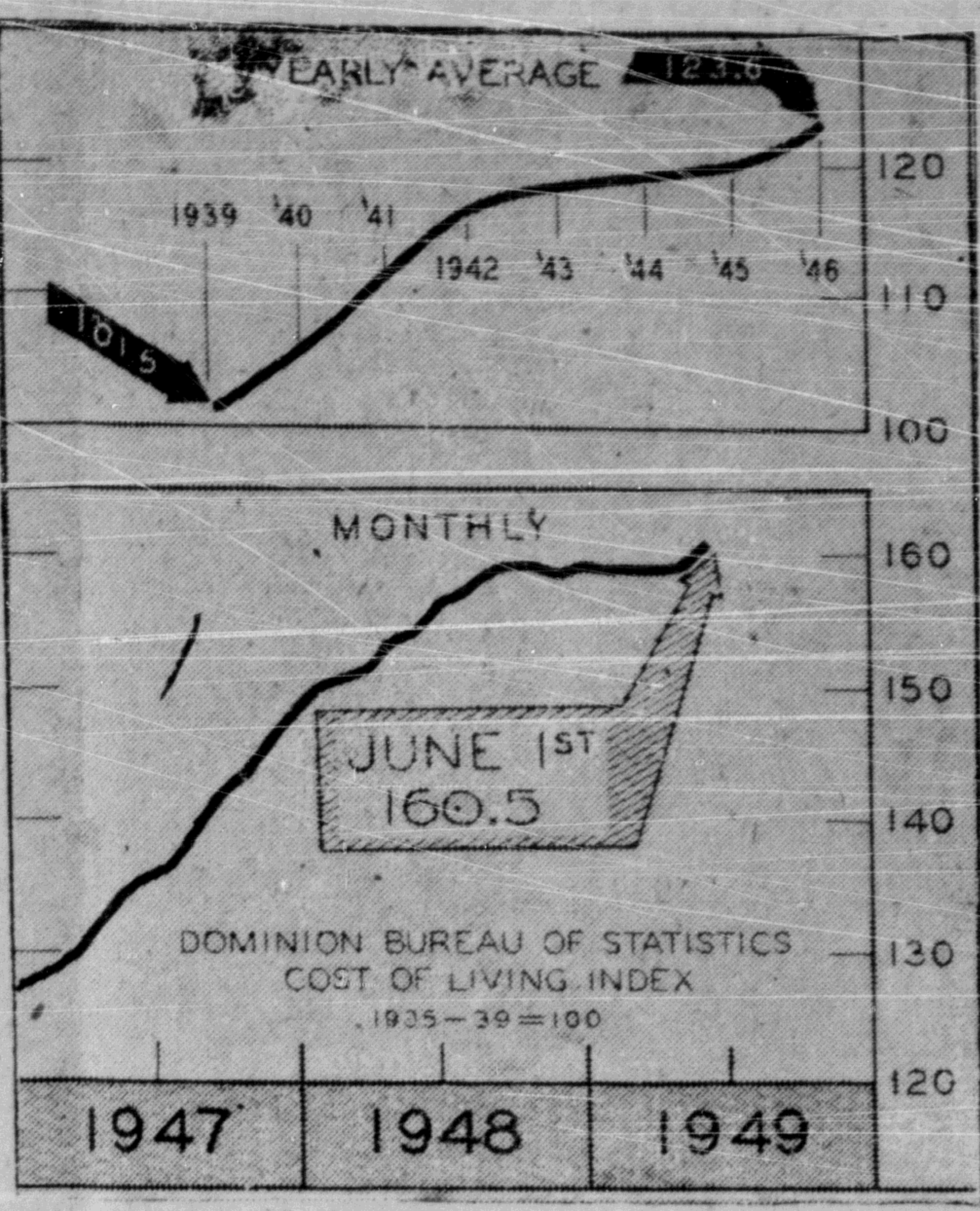
William Joy of Los Angeles, who has been paying a two weeks' visit here with his mother, is leaving by Saturday's plane on his return to Los Angeles.

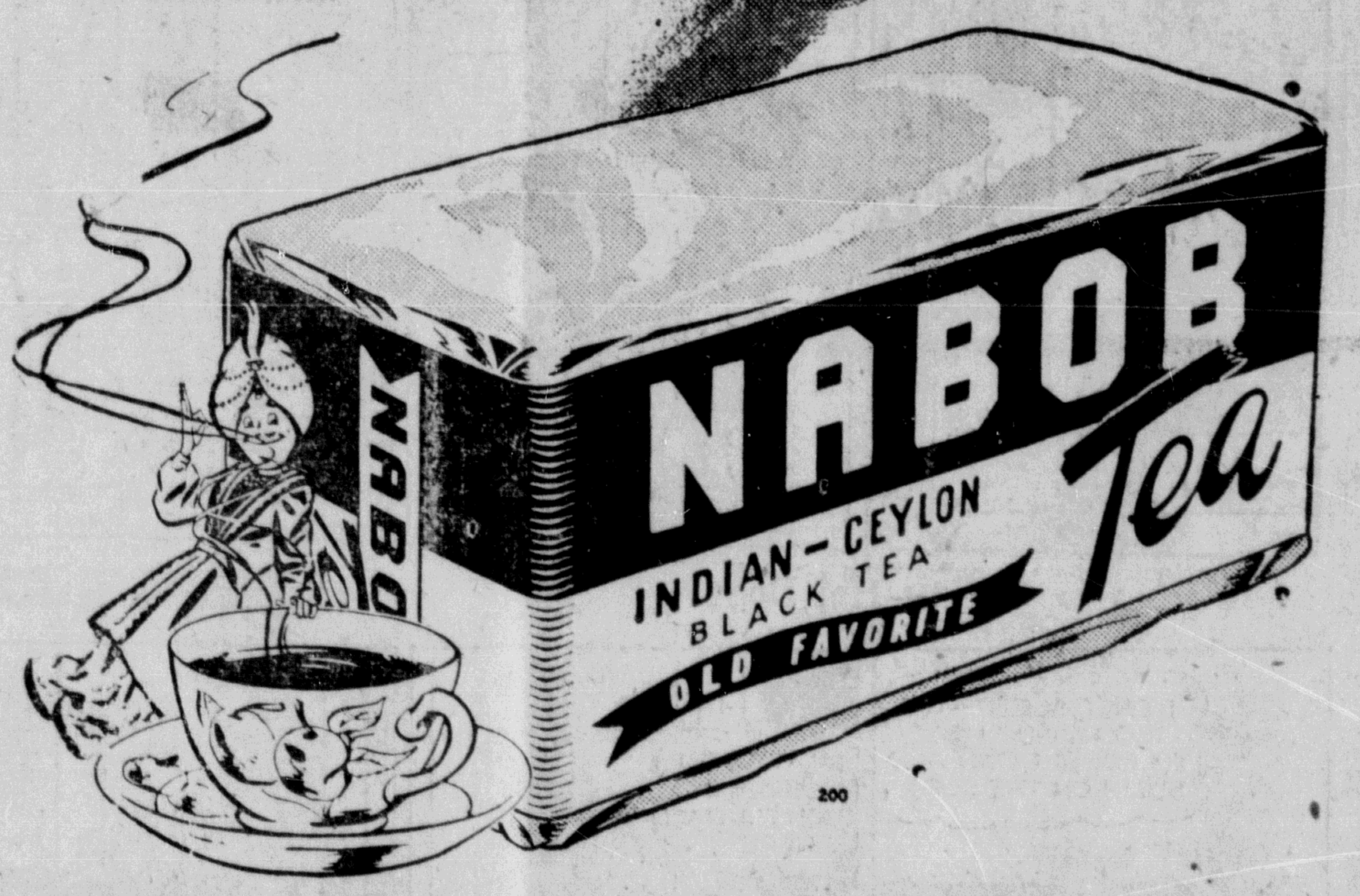

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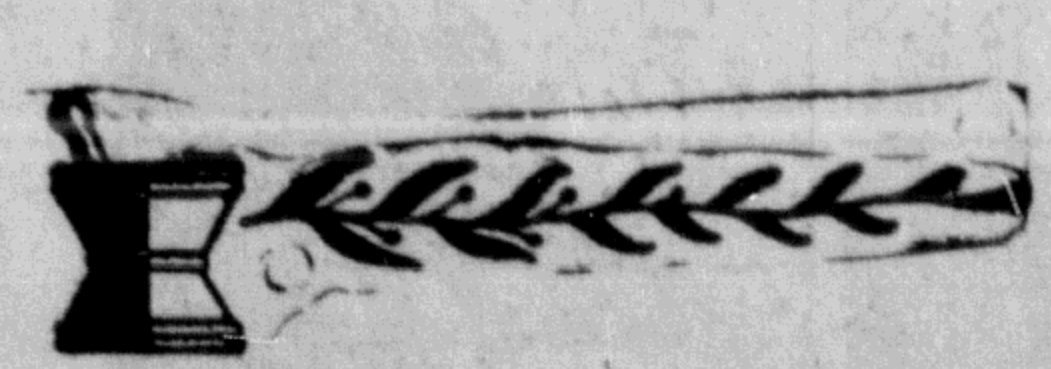
