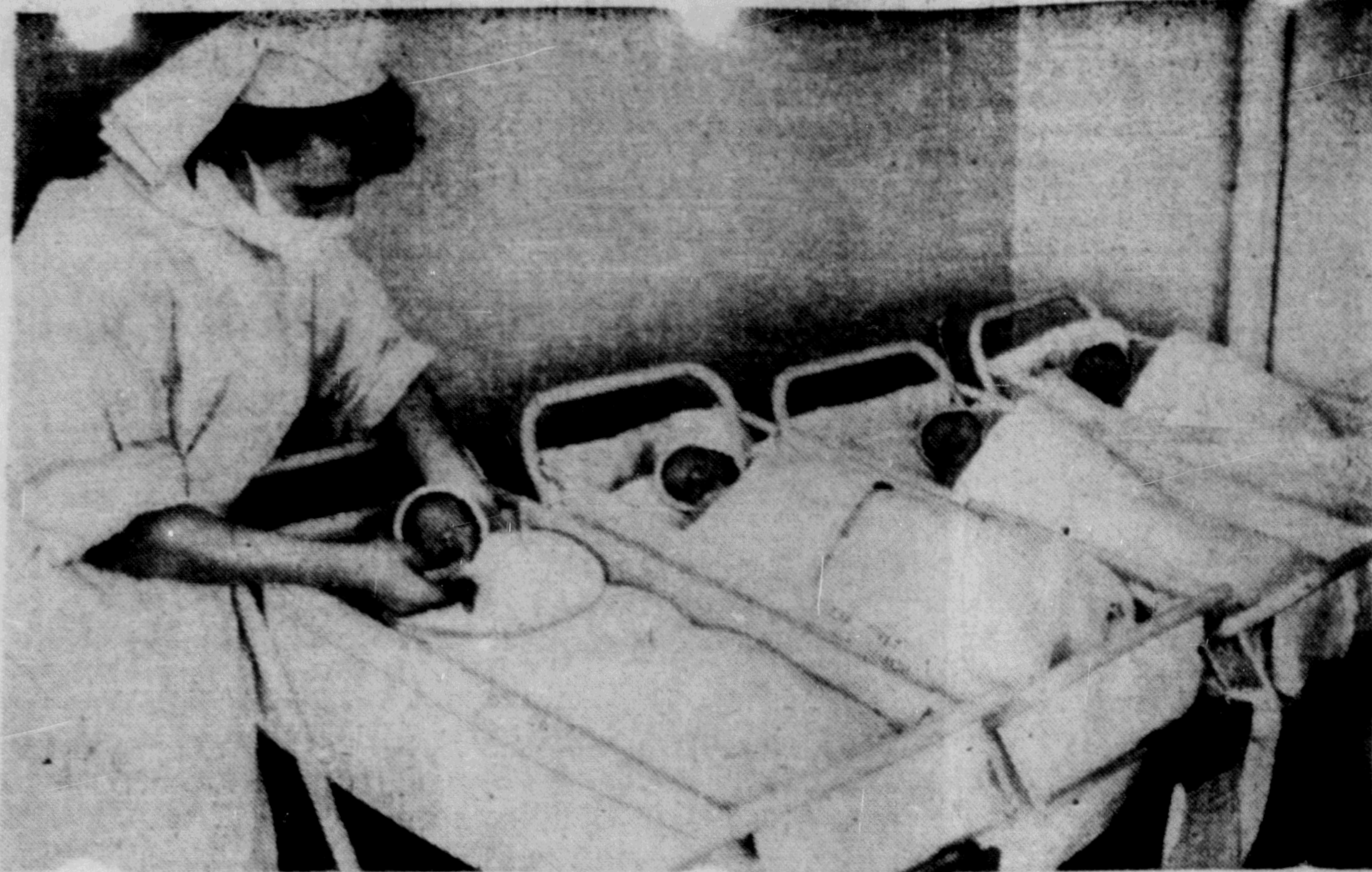

## MINE EXPECTED IN PRODUCTION NEXT JANUARY

Production at Torbrit Silver Mine, 18 miles up the Kitsault River from Alice Arm, is not expected to begin before the early part of January when installation of equipment will be complete, according to latest word from the new Mining Corporation of Canada property.

Northwest Construction Co. which is now completing construction work on bunkhouses, a dam and mine buildings totaling more than \$150,000, will be relatively inactive at the mine until next spring when further work opens up.

In the meantime, final preparations for putting electric power generators, crusher, mill and other machinery into service are being made and production is expected to start in six weeks or two months.

When in full service, the mine will employ about 190 men working three shifts daily. Production will be in excess of 300 tons of silver-lead ore daily.

Plans for next summer call for construction of a number of homes for mine employees.
