Savoy Wins Season's Most Thrilling Game

The bad weather did not keep a good-sized crowd from the most exciting basketball game of the season Saturday night as Savoy defeated Brownwoods in a close Senior match which wasn't decided until after two overtime periods had been played. With all the drama and excitement that the fans want the

The first half was even, the teams alternating with two point leads. The first quarter ended in a tie 11 all. The half-time score was 22 to 20 for Savoy. In the closing minutes of the first quarter and at the beginning of the second, Savoy netted ten consecutive foul shots before Ciccone scored a field goal for them. Brownwoods regained the lead only to have Savoy again come from behind. Brownwoods went out in front 47 to 46 with less than half a minute to play. Joe Davis came through with a penalty shot to send the game into overtime.

The play slowed down in the first overtime period with both teams playing it safe. Davis put Savoy ahead with two baskets with only a penalty shot return from Brownwoods.
