MISS NORTON IS ROTARY SPEAKER

The story of Christmas cards

—their background and the manner in which they reflect the cultures of various nations—was the subject of a talk given by Miss Dorothea Norton, New York city lecturer at the weekly meeting of the Prince Rupert Rotary Club Thursday afternoon.

The modern custom of sending Christmas cards originated in 1842 when Queen Victoria sent a number to her diplomatic friends, Miss Norton said. Some four years later, the custom was embraced by the British people and has become world wide since that time.

Using a number of cards as illustrations, Miss Norton explained how regional customs and beliefs influence the art work of the cards. Her discourse amounted into a figurative round-the-world journey.

Miss Norton's address was given in the Capitol Theatre following luncheon at the Broadway. She used a 16-mm. color film to show highlights of the painstaking process of creating the art work and manufacturing

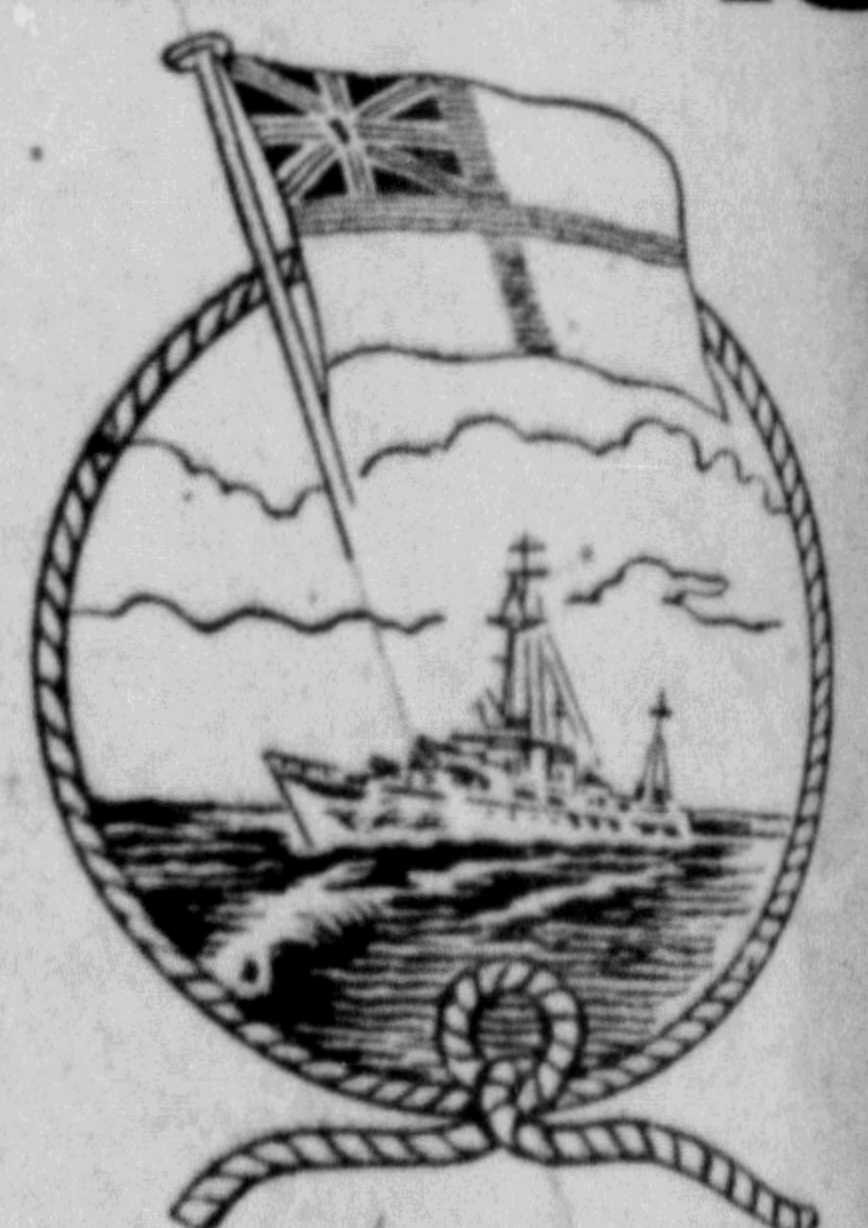
TECHNICIAN WANTED

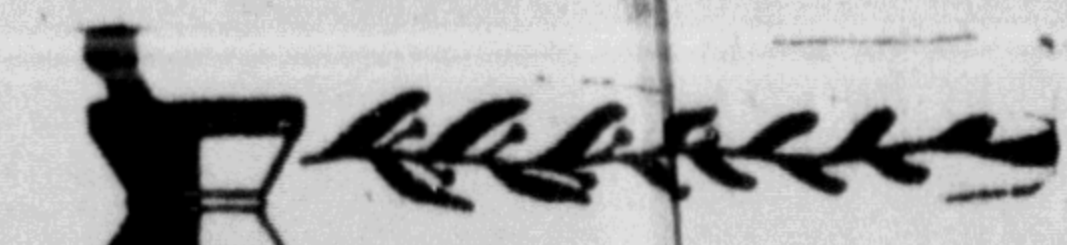
