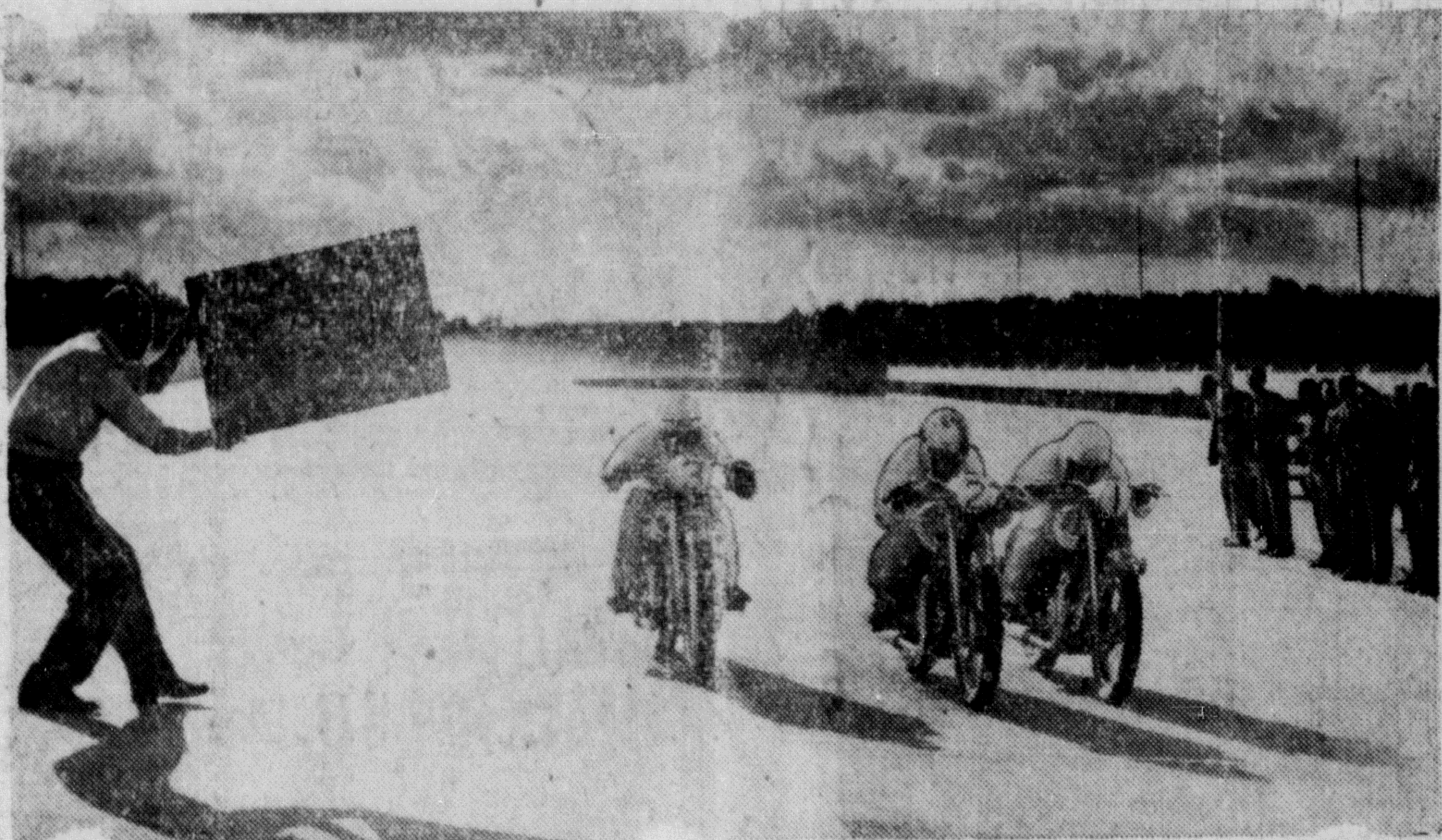

**MODEL TO CROSS CHANNEL**—Seen going through the water is a model yacht six feet long which may cross the English Channel under radio control. It was designed by Mr. J. H. P. Smith, a civil servant interested in wireless control. The model, which is being built by means of the radio, will be used to attempt to navigate the yacht across the channel. It is expected to be made this year—the yacht will be controlled by radio and can operate at a range of three miles. There are several plants available for the model's long voyage—electric.
