Struggle In Labor

It May Come in September

WASHINGTON (AP) — If there is to be a major labor struggle in the United States, steel, coal and automobile industries it probably will come in mid-September or late September.

Simultaneous strikes in all three could set the country's economy on its ear but many industrial and union leaders are counting on a seasonal economic upturn which may ease the tension and avoid such a showdown.

Industry by industry, it looks like this

Despite the torrent of bitter words from both industry spokesmen and Philip Murray, President of the C.I.O., before a fact-finding board in New York, there remains considerable optimism on both sides that a settlement can be reached without a shutdown of the mills.

The three-man board has a difficult job—to make recommendations which both sides will find palatable and face-saving. Murray has asked for a 12 1/2 percent increase in hourly pay.

The board may decide in the quarterly reports that at least 10 or 10 1/2 cents would be justified and that a group insurance plan should be negotiated at once.

COAL
John L. Lewis also is interested in what Murray decides to accept. He and his soft-coal diggers, now on a three-day work week, apparently are marking time until cold weather orders spur the coal market and until stockpiles are lower.

That won't be for at least a month. Some operators want a slowdown right away but a majority indicate they would rather work three days than not at all.

Lewis wants more money for his welfare and pension fund—probably a boost from 20 cents a ton to 30 or 40 cents—and a shorter work day or week.

AUTOS
Walter Reuther and his auto workers seemingly want to wait too and see what Murray gets from the steel industry. Reuther's major contest appears to be with Ford but he can't strike at Ford before Sept. under a new Michigan State law.

Meantime, he's pressing for concessions from Chrysler. The General Motors contract is fixed, except for cost-of-living adjustments, until 1950.
