make quick, big money for the promoters there is no doubt that the U. S. A. First line has it all over the Canada—First proposition. The big gas markets are already there, in U. S. A. and we may be sure that, if Canada hands over Canadian natural resources on the pipeline proposal that the big markets will stay in U. S. A.

British Columbia will remain a vast undeveloped Empire—with a few little towns here and there and great ports on the coast—but still mostly a sleeping wilderness.

Cheap natural gas available throughout the whole interior of B. C. might well prove the key factor in opening up B. C. as nothing else has done in our whole history.

HENCE WE HAVE a clear-cut choice. If we are content to remain an outpost people—if we are willing, generation after generation to see our brightest youngsters go off to the U. S. to seek jobs, then we should let the mainline pipeline go where its Wall Street promoters want it—via U. S. A.

But if we really want Canada to grow up, to develop, to use Canadian resources to develop, a diversified Canadian industry, then we should insist on a Canada—First pipeline—with no hidden jokers.

SURELY THE PEOPLE OF Canada have a right to demand a clear-cut stand by their elected M. P.'s on an issue so big as this. It is a downright insult to the intelligence of the people of Canada for M. P.'s and even cabinet ministers to wriggle and quibble when it comes to answering a straight question like this.

Are you for an All-Canadian pipeline to the Pacific coast; or are you for Mainline-via-U.S.A.? If you are for Canada, why the hesitation about writing into the law of the land a clause saying that the pipe shall go via Canada, and serve Canada first and foremost?

Belated May Day Demonstrations
LONDON (C)—Mounted police and riot squads clashed with crowds making a belated May Day demonstration in Trafalgar Square Sunday. Authorities arrested 69 persons.

The demonstration extended to Oxford Street, about a mile away, where mounted officers rode into crowds which were throwing traffic into confusion. Some demonstrators carried banners with slogans of a Communist flavor. One placard read, "We want Peace. Stop American warmongers."

Man Held in Case Of Slain Blonde
GLENAVON, Sask. (C)—Police today held an unidentified man for questioning in the baffling slaying of blonde Anna Yuzwak. The girl, about 22, arrived Friday. Early Saturday morning her body, a bullet hole in her head, was found in the snow behind a Glenavon home.
