## BASEBALL— Play-Off Game Tie

Darkness Halts Commercial's vs. Merchants Contest

The first game of the senior baseball play-offs ended in a 5 to 5 tie when the Commercial's overcame Merchants four-run initial inning lead. The game was called on account of darkness after the Commercial's squared the contest in the sixth inning.

Merchants' runs were scored when Abel unloaded the bases with a double to the left field fence then crossed the plate himself on a miscue. Commercial's got some errors out of their system and then went on to play sound ball. They scored a pair in the second frame when Windle and Sinclair crossed the plate after each had stolen bases. Commercial's smartest run was the one scored by Cornwell in the fifth inning when he stole home while Merchants' moundsman was in the act of delivering the ball.

he had walked the first batter on the inning which turned out to be the tying run. Howdick scored on Guthrie's safe bunt after he had been advanced on an error and Shier's third hit of the game. However, Lambie ended the rally when he caught Vanetta's bunt and doubled the runner off third base.
