**RETURNS FROM HOLIDAY CRUISE**

A call at Stewart for a Masonic gathering, a run into Wales Island to offer assistance to a fellow medical practitioner and yachtsman and an excursion to the head of Warke Canal for fishing were comprised in a four-day cruise up the coast for Dr. W. S. Kergin and son, Bill, who returned to port last evening with the Full Moon.

Departure was made here at noon Sunday for Stewart. The call at Wales Island was made when Dr. Kergin heard that Dr. R. G. Large had suffered mechanical trouble with his new boat Yaloo. However, no assistance was required.

Coming out of Warke Canal yesterday morning, Dr. Kergin encountered fog at the mouth of the Naas River and in Chatham Sound of density such as he had never experienced before. It was so thick that even the fishing fleet tied up. It lasted almost all day but cleared up perfectly in late afternoon for the run back into port.

**TELLS OF NEED FOR FOSTER HOMES**

The need for a growing number of foster homes for children of broken families was described to the Prince Rupert Rotary Club Thursday by E. I. Coughlin, district supervisor of Social Welfare, who addressed the club's weekly luncheon meeting at the Broadway.

Protection of children who are the victims of domestic discord is a major part of the work of the department, and the difficulty of finding foster homes where they can develop within an atmosphere of normalcy is becoming more difficult, he said in the course of an autobiographical address.

He outlined the province-wide system of agency centres whose functions include every type of social welfare work.
