FACED WITH THE PROBLEM OF A BABY SITTER?—Every mother needs some time out of the home for recreation, but if there is a child that needs to be looked after she is faced with the problem of getting a baby sitter. Considerate husbands occasionally look after the baby while mother goes out to do a bit of shopping or attend some meeting. One thing to remember when you begin with a baby-sitter is to have her arrive early enough to become acquainted with your child before you leave. If the child at left awakened to find herself in the arms of a stranger, she would become alarmed and upset. Explain to your child that the baby-sitter has sole authority in your absence.
